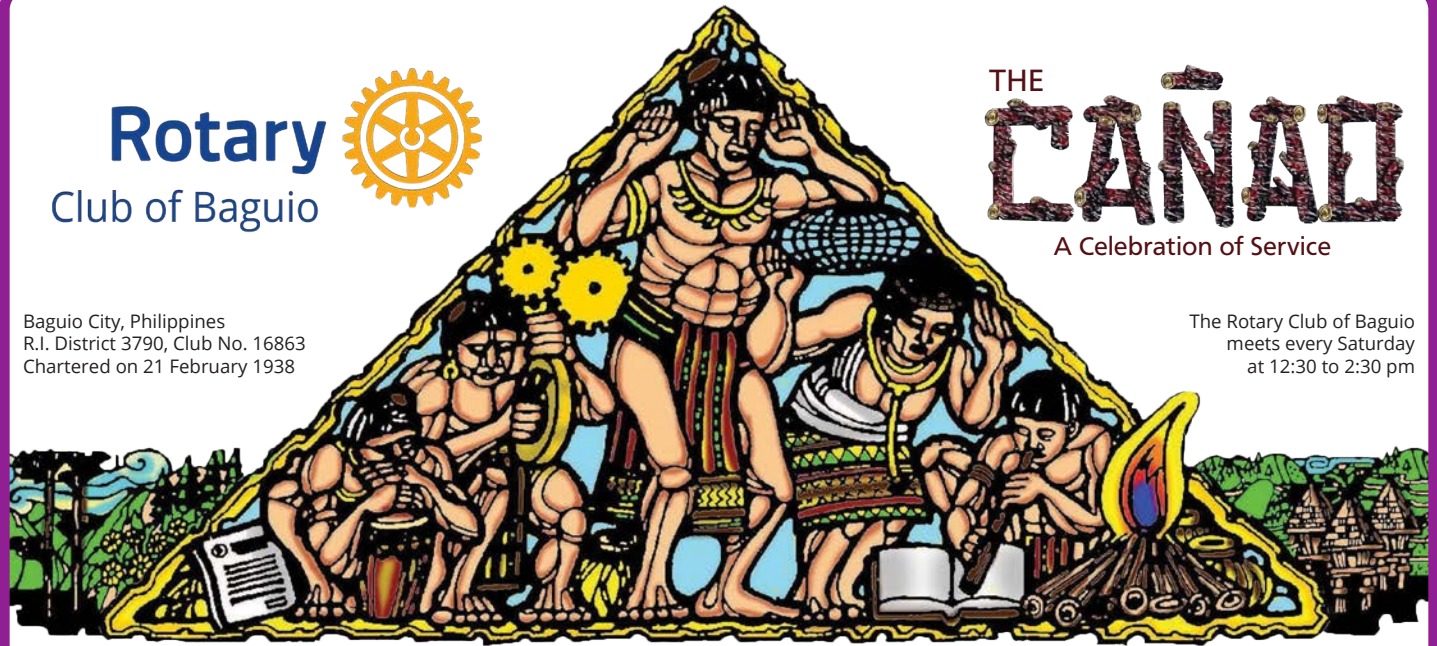

Short Biography

Donna Tabangin is a licensed Architect and Environmental Planner with 23 years of experience in the Applied Sciences as a Faculty of the School of Engineering and Architecture of Saint Louis University (SLU) in Baguio City, Philippines where she taught Computer-Aided Design and Geographic Information Systems in the graduate and undergraduate programs. Adjunct to this, she was the Officer-in-Charge of the Engineering and Urban Planning Research Laboratory. She finished her Bachelor's Degree in Architecture at Saint Louis University and a Master's Degree in Urban and Regional Planning at the University of the Philippines School of Urban and Regional Planning at Diliman, Quezon City. She has obtained advanced professional certifications such as Geographic Information Systems for Land Evaluation at the School of Earth Sciences in the Catholic University of Leuven, Belgium; Communications and Technology for Disaster Management at the United States Telecommunications Training Institute at Washington D.C.; and Disaster Risk Reduction and Management at Coventry University, United Kingdom.

In 2016, after serving as a visiting researcher in Technology Entrepreneurship and Design at University of California Berkeley, she founded the SLU Incubator for Research, Innovation and Business (SIRIB Center). This Center has evolved to become a TechHub which includes a Digital Fabrication Laboratory (FabLab) and a Technology Business Incubator. This TechHub is one of the first 5 TechHubs in the Philippines and its mission is to move technology-intimate researches/projects from the academe as well as from the community towards Intellectual Property protection, business mentoring, and commercialization. The hub is also involved in providing technical support to SMEs especially on product development, branding, and design.

She recently joined public service as the City Planning and Development Coordinator of the City Baguio in July 2020. She currently leads the office which is in charge of the formulation of development plans, comprehensive land use plans, project development and monitoring, urban master planning, and creative design for the city.

6. He also mentioned that our RCB District Governor Anne Lorenzana will be in Baguio starting September 25 to conduct inductions of the different Rotary Clubs in Baguio-Benguet up to September 29, 2022(RCB's Induction).
7. Announcements of the following District Functions:
 - a. 15 October 2022- Tri Sem District Seminar in Pangasinan
 - b. 23 October 2022-Alay Lakad for "END POLIO" by Cluster I-C clubs.
8. Thanked PP Raffy Chan for coming up with 7,000 series forms which was already approved by the BOD and will be presented to legal team for inclusion to RCB By-laws.
9. Expressed his sincerest thanks to the Sibling "Trios" (Lou, Saould and Eric) for deciding to be Rotary Club of Baguio members.

Induction ceremonies followed, first with the Introduction of the RCB Inductees by our RCB Secretary, PP Baby Kaur: (1) Atty. Ailyn Kindipan(Classification: Legal-Civil Law) accompanied by her spouse Atty. Edmond Kindipan and sponsor by Pres Ali and (2) Mr. Eric de Guzman(Classification: PR/Consumer Welfare) and Sponsor PP Mia Cawed.

Charging of the Prospective New Rotarians was extensively done by our first RCB Lady President, PP Veeh Balajo. Started with a reminder on the Preamble for Rotarians- That Rotary is NOT a political organization, NOT a charitable organization, NOT a religious organization but an organization of professionals and business for fellowship and service. She reminded everyone about

the "Four-Way Test". That once you are admitted as a Rotarian you are now a member of the worldwide organization-"Rotary". He reminded everyone to attend meetings regularly, pay dues on time and participate in community service projects.

President Ali Morales then inducted our two Inductees-Atty. Ailyn Kindipan and Mr. Eric de Guzman as the members and guests solemnly stand up to witness their pledge as new RCB members.

Introduction of our GHS, newly inducted Rotarian Eric de Guzman was done by our Team BRE leader, PP Diony Claridad. He was introduced as a PR and Consumer Welfare officer and actively participates in the management of BENECO.

Our GHS Eric started his talk on the "Basic structure of the Power industry and Understanding the Unbundled electricity rates" by tracing the history of the industry last 1936 with the establishment of the National Power Corporation (NPC)who was then in charge of the generation and transmission. The power industry is composed of generation, transmission, and distribution and supply. The Epira Law established last 2001 give way to establishment of different electric cooperatives such as Meralco, Beneco etc. as active participants in the distribution sector. He discussed further about the distribution supply, metering charges and the source of BENECO funds to fund employees' salaries and capital expenditure projects such as rehabilitation of lines and expansion programs. He told us about the BENECO project of putting up their 1 MW power generation project in Abatan which is still on the approval process. He also mentioned about the lifeline rate subsidy/discount for the marginalized population and the Senior citizen discounts. Overall, Rotarian Eric provided us with a clearer understanding about the power industry and BENECO as an electric cooperative.

Numerous questions and inquiries were thrown to our GHS from environment preservation, power interruptions and even the purchase of BENECO of a prime lot as its central office etc. which were all answered satisfactorily by our GHS.

Response of our Club was then delivered by the sponsor of our new Rotarian and GHS-PP Mia Cawed expressing our Club's gratefulness for the extensive lecture given by our GHS followed by the awarding of Certificate of Appreciation and President's gift to our GHS Rtn Eric de Guzman.

The singing of the RCB hymn and the Pilipinas kong Mahal follows. President Ali adjourned the meeting at exactly 3:05 P.M.

In August, I was proud to visit Pakistan and highlight Rotary's top goal, eradicating polio. It was also a tremendous opportunity to spotlight female health workers who are playing a critical role in protecting children from this vaccine-preventable disease.

This month, as we celebrate World Polio Day, we are shining a spotlight on our more than 30-year effort to lead the first global polio eradication campaign and our success in forming partnerships capable of completing this massive goal. We all know that this is one of the most ambitious global health initiatives in history and that we've reduced polio cases by more than 99.9 percent worldwide.

Pakistan is one of only two countries in the world where wild poliovirus remains endemic. (The other is neighboring Afghanistan.) I was able to witness and take part in vaccination campaigns in Pakistan, and soon after I left, a monumental nationwide immunization campaign took place, focused on 43 million children under the age of 5. I saw the incredible work of Rotary members on the ground. More than 60 percent of vaccinators in Pakistan are women, and they are doing a remarkable job building trust and convincing mothers to vaccinate their children.

Seeing it all firsthand, I know that the will exists across the Rotary world to end polio, and I'm confident that we have the strategy. The Pakistani media has been very supportive of our efforts as well, and this is making a difference. This month, a new global pledging moment at the World Health Summit in Berlin promises to pull together more resources to fund these time-sensitive eradication efforts. Now it is up to us to do our part and raise \$50 million this year to earn the full 2-to-1 match from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

There's great cause for optimism on the polio front — but also some staggering new events that have further raised the stakes. Over the past few months, new polio outbreaks have occurred in Israel, the United Kingdom and, most recently, in the New York City area. These stories are frightening, but in every case, the response is clear — vaccines work, and if polio is spreading, we need to make sure the most at-risk people have kept their vaccinations up to date.

Most importantly, we need to eradicate this virus now. If polio exists anywhere, it can spread everywhere. What I saw in Pakistan convinced me that we can and must finish the job, but it will only happen if we remain committed to a strategy that's working and back it with all necessary resources.

Through our commitment, generosity, and sheer determination, we will #EndPolio.

The human touch

A Ukrainian family found refuge in the home of a Polish Rotarian

On 24 February 2022, Russia invades Ukraine. Its 22nd Army Corps advances on the nuclear power plant at Zaporizhzhia, the city on the Dnieper River in southeastern Ukraine that is home to the Morhun family.

Olena Morhun, a pharmacist: I found out that the war had started at night. My husband woke me up and said that Ukraine was under fire and Russian troops had crossed the Ukrainian border. He told me he didn't want me to stay in Ukraine while we have war. He wanted us to go far away from Zaporizhzhia, away from eastern Ukraine. That's when we started talking about where we could go and how.

Alisa Morhun, one of Olena's children: One day before the war started, I went to visit my friend, and I stayed at her place for the night. Sometime in the morning, at about 6 o'clock, she woke me up. I was still very sleepy. She told me, "The war has started in Ukraine." It all seemed very strange to me. At first, I couldn't even make any sense out of it. When you read the news, you start comprehending all those things that are happening. It is hard to understand, in a quick flash, that your normal life is being destroyed.

"The two boys played together really naturally," says Kim Widlicki, the Zurich-based senior marketing and social media strategist who was part of Rotary's three-person interview team. "It seemed to us that the boys have known each other for years. They had a very nice bond between them, as did all the families together."

On 27 February, Olena Morhun leaves Zaporizhzhia with her daughters, Alisa and Sofiia, and her son Vitalii, known affectionately as Vitalik.

Olena: We left Zaporizhzhia on the Zaporizhzhia-Lviv evacuation train. Our intention was to stay in western Ukraine, but when we got off the train and started talking to people in Lviv, they talked us out of it. Their city was also shelled. It turned out that the place we thought would be safe wasn't safe at all. All of Ukraine was in danger. A girl at the volunteer center sat down with me, and we talked for a good part of the night. She helped me make a decision to go to Poland instead of staying in Ukraine. I'll never forget that girl.

Alisa: When we were crossing the Polish border, we didn't know where we would end up or what we would be doing over here. There was no plan at all. We just hoped for the best. We crossed the border on foot and then ended up at a distribution center. Volunteers helped us. They found people who wanted to help and take Ukrainian refugees into their own homes.

After a four-day journey of more than 700 miles, the Morhun family reaches Puławy, Poland, where Krystyna Wilczyńska-Ciemiega, a member of the Rotary Club of Puławy, lives with her son, Grzesio, and her son's wife, Weronika Kowalska. (In addition to the Morhun family, Wilczyńska-Ciemiega opens her home to two more people from Zaporizhzhia, Ulzana Shakirova and her son, Tymur.)

Krystyna Wilczyńska-Ciemiega: We waited until midnight, then midnight came and went, and they hadn't arrived yet.

Alisa: Vitalik fell asleep in the car while we were traveling, and when it was time to wake him up, he was very upset. He cried. This was tremendously stressful for him.

Krystyna: They were completely exhausted, the children especially. I can't even describe it. They had traveled by train for over a day just from Zaporizhzhia to Lviv. And then, the various obstacles with transport to the Polish

border took time and the rest of their strength. So, they only wanted to sleep, sleep, and sleep some more.

Olena: When we first arrived, I thought it wouldn't be too long. A week or two, maybe a month, and we'd go home. I didn't plan to live in Poland. I couldn't accept the thought that I would be here for a long time. After a month or so, I started to understand that I wouldn't be able to get back home so soon, that the war might last a long time.

Krystyna: From the beginning, there was no such thing as us hosting. Because you can host someone for three days, and after three days, sometimes, you have had enough of the guest. We knew that it was going to be for a long time, and there was no designated end date. And from the beginning, relationships were formed as if we were family here.

Olena: Krystyna loves children. Vitalik is reserved with people he doesn't know, but he accepted her right away. He even hugs her, which he doesn't do with strangers.

Krystyna: From the moment the war broke out, it was obvious that Poles not only should accept refugees but that they were simply going to. We wanted to give them a heartfelt welcome. I do have some memories that influenced my decision. I still remember both the war [World War II] and the stories about the war, my parents' stories most of all. We too were chased from place to place. Maybe those are the memories that led me to say, Yes, I will help. But I think it's generally my character. The character of every Rotarian is based on a preference to give rather than to take. People ask how it feels to do something like this, and I tell them that the first emotion is joy because people like to give.

who would share what she has with anyone who needs help. When I mention at a meeting with Rotarians that I am going to visit Kryisia, they all ask me to greet her. So I bring her lots of warm greetings from Rotarians in Lublin and Zamość. There is a great family atmosphere at her home. Weronika teaches them Polish, and in the mornings she drives the children to school. They share the cleaning, the laundry, and the cooking and come to an agreement without any problems, just like a good and happy family."

Bottom right: Ulzana Shakirova pauses in a park while walking with Wilczyńska-Ciemiega's dog. "There's no leash here; he listens to her," marvels Lozinska. "He came to her when she called him in the park. If the dog is able to adopt you like that, it says something. Animals will not just trust anyone so easily."



By the end of April, it begins to dawn on the Morhun family that they won't be returning to Ukraine soon, forcing them to grapple with how to plan for an uncertain future.

Olena: My thoughts are always about Ukraine. That's why it's so difficult for me. I've been trying to realize that I'm not at home and somehow I need to build my life over here. But how can I build it? So, to say that I have some plans — I have only one plan, to get back home. But I do understand that this plan, it won't happen quickly. So I'm making some small plans: to learn Polish, to find a job, and so on.

Alisa: My hope for the future, my dream? Zaporizhzhia is the city where I was born, and I want to get back to it. I left my home without knowing whether I'd return to it in a week or in two years. So first of all, I want to go back to Ukraine, to my home, and then to get on with my life. Maybe it will not be soon, maybe after many years, or maybe never. In that case, I'll have to move on with my life somewhere else.

Krystyna: In 1993, when the Rotary Club of Puławy was chartered, if you wanted to be a councilor or a politician and act on behalf of others, you had to have the soul of a social activist. That's what it's called in Poland, and we all belonged to that class of people. We already had this thing in our character, that we're supposed to act for the benefit of others, just like the main motto of Rotary: Service Above Self. So it's kind of second nature to all of us who are in the Rotary Club of Puławy.

How to Sponsor a New Rotarian - Membership is by Invitation!

Rotarians have a responsibility to contribute to their club's vitality, success and growth. A commitment to service within our club and in the local and global communities is a basic quality which potential Rotary candidates should possess. When evaluating a person to nominate for membership in our club, consider the candidate's desire to be an active for new members is a continuous one. The ultimate goal achieved by bringing a new member into the club is to fill a vacant classification with a person who will be a long term contributor toward the goals of Rotary and your club.

Steps to Membership in our Rotary Club

1. Proposed Member Visits (candidate must come to three (3) meetings before being proposed for membership) Please do not introduce your guest as a future member or club guest during these visits. It could be embarrassing if there are objections to the proposed candidate by other members or if the board decides not to approve their application. Do introduce the candidate clearly mentioning their company and position. Do not rush the introduction, make sure the members hear that you are introducing a prospective new member. This will give members a heads up that you are considering sponsoring this person. You will foot the bill for your guest's meals.

2. Proposal Card Received by Secretary

You have started the membership ball rolling. The Secretary will forward the information to the Membership Chair and Classification Committee. Our club assigns a classification before sending it to the Membership Committee - other clubs have the Membership Committee assign the classification.

3. Proposal Reviewed by Classification Committee

The Classification Committee reviews the proposal to make sure we have an appropriate classification available and that the classification is not filled by more than 10% of the club. The ball (the proposal) is now returned to the Secretary who refers it to the Membership Committee.

4. Proposal Reviewed by Membership Committee

The Membership Committee is charged with giving the Board of Directors a recommendation for approval or rejection of the proposal. The committee determines if the candidate has met the basic requirements for membership. The committee will notify the Secretary of its findings and its recommendation for or against membership in the club.

5. Board Votes on Candidate

The board will vote to sustain or reject the recommendation

of the Membership Committee. The board may elect to overturn a recommendation (favorable or unfavorable) in addition, the board may elect to return the proposal back to the committee for further consideration and action.

6. Proposer/Sponsor Notified

The secretary will notify the sponsor whether or not the proposed candidate was accepted for membership. If approved - the sponsor will tell the candidate that they have been selected for membership in the club and extend an invitation to join the club. This is the ideal time to mention details about what it costs to be a member, the time commitment, and other information. The sponsor will ask permission to publish their name to the membership as a club guest. (This is the first time the candidate is specifically told they are being considered for membership.) If rejected - the sponsor will be notified that the proposal was not approved.

7. Introduction to Members

The candidate is formally announced as a club guest. This is when the club is made aware of the candidate's formal application for membership and a Seven Day Notice is sent to all Rotary members, this being the period for objections to the proposed membership. The club starts buying the club guest's lunch and they are encouraged to attend social events during this time (at their expense).

8. The Seven Day Notice

The publication of a club guest's name in the Cañao is the formal notification to all members about the impending induction of a new member. Club members have seven days to notify the club secretary of any concerns.

9. Rotary Information Session

The FIRESIDE CHAT is scheduled after the seven day period ends and is intended to fully inform the candidate of the financial burden, the time commitment and answer questions about our club. The session will be conducted by the club president, past president or club secretary. The participants will include the club president and membership chair, the candidate and their spouse, the sponsor and the assigned mentor. The candidate will be given a written overview of the club and their responsibilities. The membership application is given to the candidate at the end of this session.

10. Induction of the new member into Rotary Club of Baguio.

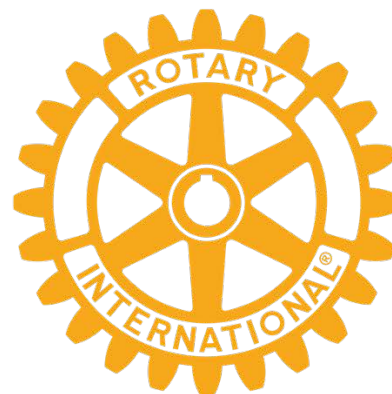

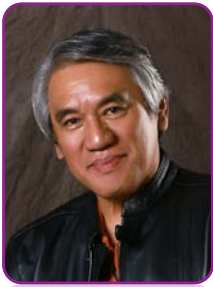

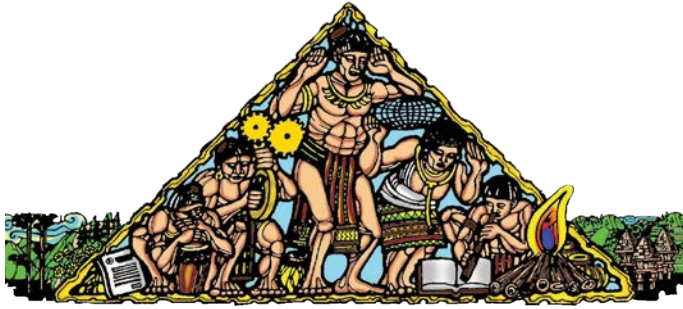

THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community—always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to
