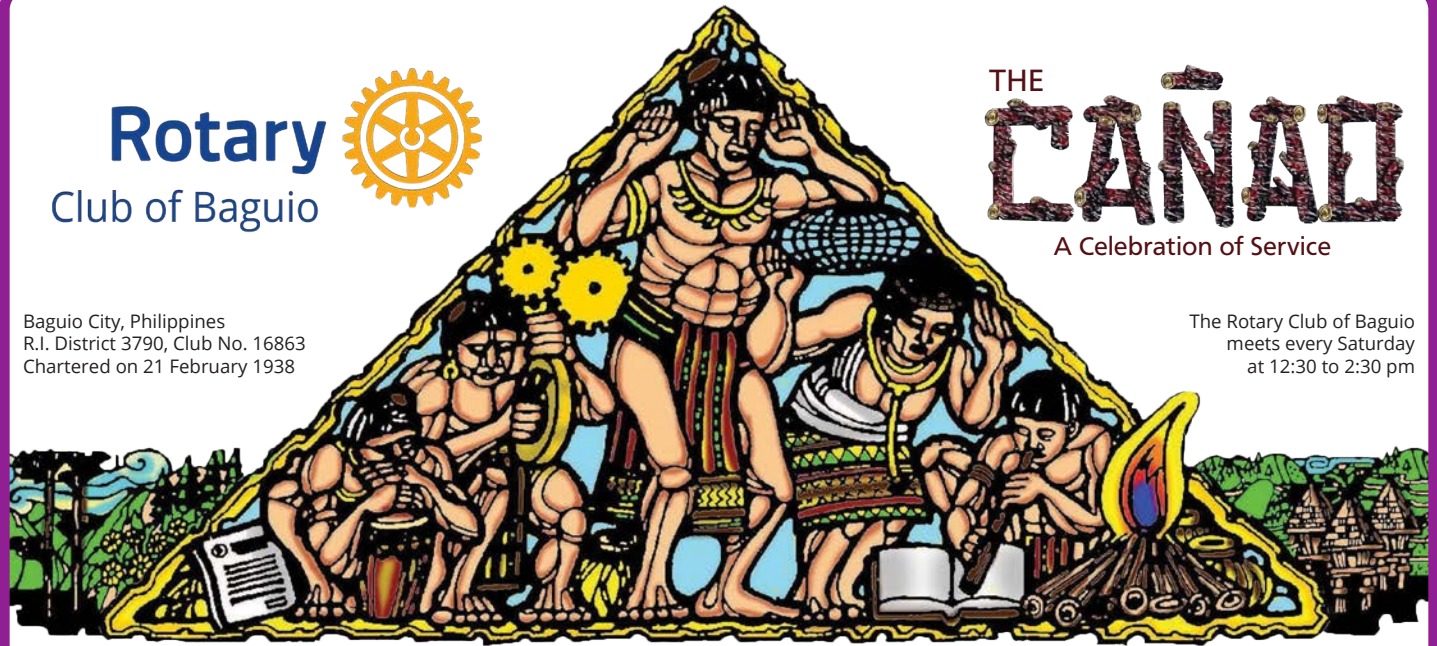

PP Benny was just on time for the meeting as he was the program coordinator for the first meeting for the month of October head by team BRIA. Pres. Ali called the meeting to order at exactly 12:30 PM. A new member of the team, Rtn Eric, did the invocation then followed by the singing of the Lupang Hinirang, Rotary Hymn and the Four Way Test. IN RETROSPECT

In celebration of World Polio Day on 23 October, there will be an "Alay Lakad" by Cluster 1C Rotarians at 8:00 AM and meeting place is upper Session Road.

RYLA will also be hosted by RC Baguio, RCB Highlands and RC Metro Baguio.

PP Raffy introduced our guest of honor and speaker who was mentor by PP Raffy, and later the table turned as architect Donna was the adviser of PP Raffy in his thesis and graduated as magna cum laude.

Smart Livable Baguio by 2043 this was the topic of our speaker. As any other city, Baguio has exceeded its carrying capacity. More and more people are coming here to study, work or as tourists. This increases our waste which we bring to Tarlac and spend more than 2,000,000 pesos yearly. The city government has started some projects like zoning of buildings, getting back lands that were encroached specially in watersheds.

The also have talked with nearby municipalities for the construction of hubs where buses will drop their passengers as they will not be allowed to enter the city anymore. The south bound hub will be in Marcos High way, north bound hub in Naguilian, Cordillera hub will be in slaughter compound and an Eco hub along Kenon Road.

There must also be a safety net in construction such as waste recycling, green building, proper building permits and nature safe infrastructure.

There is so much to be done but is achievable with the right people in position. The 2043 plan is very promising and I hope we can all still be here to see this materialize.

Some questions asked during the open forum from

Q PP Atom is that the number of tourists entering the city who are draining our resources and are adding to our carrying capacity. What will the government do to regulate this?

A The city is planning to have a visa system or like the bisita Baguio app where they control visitors and to encourage only spending tourists.

Q PP Libby How come condos are being constructed in residential areas

A There will be proper zoning in the future

Comments: PP Caloy Baguio water district has not increased ground water resources. There are a lot of water resources in the city and he can help.

PP Marilyn Looks good and expensive how do the government get places that are not developed so city and private to come together for a partnership.

PP Chris Faelnar One of the concerns is the waste, why not turn waste to energy. The city could use the hydro power plants in Tuba & Sablan.

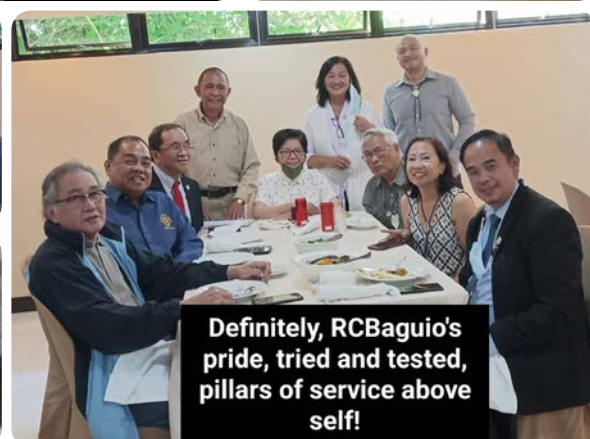
PP Raffy Political will is very much needed to pursue this project and it is only Mayor Magalong who has started this and should continue with the next administrations to come.

Rotary Projects Around the Globe – October 2022

Canada

Vancouver Rotarians plugged in to their local connections to spotlight End Polio Now in British Columbia. Three landmarks — BC Place Stadium, the geodesic dome of Science World, and the City Hall clock tower — were set aglow for World Polio Day in 2021. Ron Suzuki, a member of the Rotary Club of Vancouver Sunrise and a retired city recreation director, used his connections to line up support from city leaders, including Mayor Kennedy Stewart, who recognized the day by proclamation. As a college student in the early 1970s, Suzuki undertook fieldwork in the polio wing of a hospital. “I got to know all the patients and was inspired by their courage and how they coped with this horrible disease,” Suzuki says. “Till this day I am still haunted by the sounds of the machines that helped them breathe.”



United States



The Interact club at Honesdale High School in Pennsylvania held its Purple Pinkie Project in February to spread the word about polio eradication. Club members went live on the radio, canvassed local businesses for contributions, and solicited

dollar donations in exchange for coloring pinkies purple during school lunch breaks and basketball games. The club raised \$1,000, and members of the Rotary Club of Honesdale added \$500 for the cause. An online “twinning” with the Interact Club of Chubby Cheeks Spring Valley in Goa, India, allowed the clubs to exchange tips on matters purple pinkie and beyond. “These students are networked and organized,” says Brian Fulp, the Interact club’s adviser, “and the community responds through donations.”

United Kingdom

In October 2021, staff and students of Felpham Community College in West Sussex planted more than 4,000 crocuses provided by the Rotary Club of Bognor Regis as part of Rotary International in Great Britain and Ireland’s annual Purple4Polio campaign. In February, as the flowers began to bloom, the college convened students from the ecology club and other school groups for a tea party. “This was a chance



to have a hot drink and some homemade sweet treats, celebrate the crocuses coming into bloom, and thank our students for the hard work they put in above and beyond their day-to-day learning,” says Michelle Kelly, a deputy head teacher. The Bognor Regis club and the school have partnered on the project for more than 10 years.

Nigeria

Seven Rotary clubs and two Rotaract clubs in the southern Nigerian state of Delta took steps in October 2021 to heighten vigilance in a country certified polio-free the year before. The Polio Walk, organized by the Rotary Club of Effurun, attracted nearly 100 participants. The walkers — many clad in red, blue, yellow, and purple End Polio Now T-shirts — strolled, socialized, beat drums, and tooted horns along a roughly 2-mile route, says Michael Enehizena, past president of the Effurun club. “It was a huge success as flyers and car stickers were given out and placed on cars,” Enehizena adds. The Rotary clubs of Effurun City Centre, Effurun Gateway, Effurun GRA, Ekpan, Osubi, and Owwian, as well as the Rotaract clubs of Effurun and Petroleum Training Institute (PTI), united for the event.



New Zealand



Seeking a hallmark project to boost attention and money for PolioPlus during his year as governor of District 9980, Nick Wood picked pumpkins — a variety called the Atlantic Giant, to be specific. Fifty-five Rotarians, family members,

and friends competed to grow the greatest gourd from plants that Wood started and distributed beginning in late October of last year. The goal: “to have fun, and this was heaps of fun,” Wood says. The grand weigh-in in late April required a forklift when the Rotary Club of Wanaka’s winning pumpkin tipped the scales at more than 357 pounds. With sponsors donating a set amount for each kilogram, the competition yielded more than US\$31,000 at current exchange rates, topped with a District Designated Fund contribution of about \$6,200, all matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. “The biggest success was the almost doubling of our club and personal contributions to polio from the previous year,” says Wood.

Kid, You Can project helps children take first steps

I remember how impatiently I waited for my Varvara to run. I waited for my daughter's first step for 10 months. But there are parents who wait for years. And there are those who will never experience this happiness.

What is it like for a young person who can't lean on his own feet? How do they see the world? What is their social circle? Are they confined to the four walls of a small apartment, where they are heroically dragged along by their mother, whose life begins and ends with a child with special needs.

Louis Pasteur once said: "There's nothing like the opportunity to be the cause of a good change in someone's life." I find this saying truer than ever.

Spring was rough for Rotary clubs in Russia. There was a barrage of hatred and curses directed at us as individuals that shook us to our core. But in it, we clung to the belief that the work we do through Rotary is more necessary now than ever. Our projects are about changing lives.

We went forward with our project to work with an international partner from Armenia with the support of Rotary clubs in the United States. The "Kid, You Can" project grew out of a district grant. At a volunteer forum, a member of the Rotary Club of Moscow East met Olga Paramonova, an unusually enthusiastic rehabilitator. She has spent more than two decades devoted to helping children with various musculoskeletal system disorders be able to stand and take their first steps.

Paramonova overcomes inertia and indifference at orphanages and among some instructors at rehabilitation centers. She motivates people to work to put children

back on their feet. She believes everyone can be helped. A child may not be able to walk on their own, but they can definitely improve their situation.

A miracle happened with Romka. Romka and his mother, Yulia, came to the center where our club supplied a Katusha verticalizer, a multifunctional device which helps people with disabilities learn to keep their balance and restore their center of gravity. Romka had many diagnoses. He has autism and cerebral palsy. He can't even sit up.

Paramonova worked for one year and four months without a break, with the mom's full commitment and the support of the club. And then we saw the miracle: Romka hanging completely on the instructor's legs, getting up on the rollers, and then getting into his shoes, going for a toy. Then he took his first two independent steps toward his mom. We were speechless. You should have seen the look in Yulia's eyes. We wanted to bring that miracle back into the world, and multiply it.

I asked my friends to chip in for one more Katusha for my birthday. I knew exactly where to take it.

Our club has helped provide equipment, but the real miracle lies with Paramonova. Her technique instills courage in even the shiest child. She gets down on their level and rolls around with them on the carpet. Then sweaty, and happy, they eventually take those first steps, overcoming their fear of heights to emerge victorious. We cry every time we get a video from a parent of this triumph.

We will be going soon to our partner clubs with equipment for more children unlikely to walk on their own. And I believe, each of these six participating clubs will make a movie about their own miracle stories.

Together with our partners in Armenia and India, we have applied for further funding and are waiting for support from [The Rotary Foundation](#). Our next phase will involve 14 clubs. More children who will be able to get back on their feet and more mothers will sprout wings of joy.

What else has this project taught me? Whenever we share our project with others, we always see an increase in donations to the Foundation. When we showed a video of Romka's rehabilitation at our district conference, we raised a record amount for the Foundation.

Whatever Rotary means to us, the world judges by the results of our projects. Let's create more projects like this one and be the cause of good in the world.

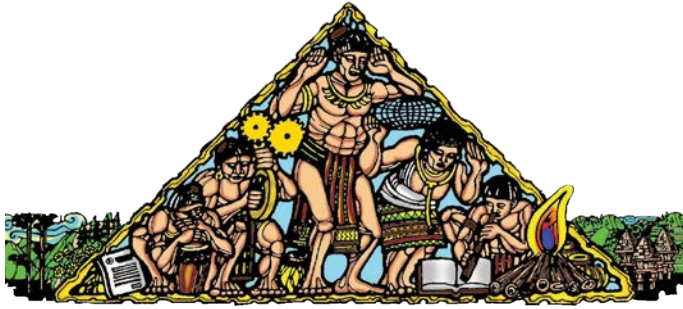

THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community—always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to
