## Polio - A threat to every child

ometimes I catch myself admiring my daughter as she reads a book at bedtime or does her math homework. These are skills we have come to expect from a child at her age. However, my memories as a young girl living with a disability from polio in Somalia are quite different.

I remember every morning I would wake at the peak of dawn, brush my teeth, comb my hair and change for the day. I then would sit outside our front door and watch as children from my neighborhood walk to school with their thermos full of water and school bags on their backs. I would wave to them with a smile but internally I was crushed.

At that age I knew two things for certain; one, I wanted to also carry a thermos and a backpack and walk alongside my peers, and two, something life changing was happening at that building they called school and I was missing out.

I was missing out because as a toddler I contracted polio – a highly contagious disease that attacked my brain and left me partially paralyzed from the waist down. As a result, I spent the first six years of my life crawling. It was clear to me growing up that because I had a physical disability, my experience was going to be vastly different from other children.

Children with disabilities face many barriers, including, for me, an inaccessible physical environment. Also, being a girl meant additional restrictions, as any available resources would go to boys with disabilities first – and it was rare that there would be enough for all of us.

When the civil war in Somalia broke out, my family and I migrated to Canada. Moving to a new country meant new experiences. I was first taken to the Hospital for Sick Children in Toronto and was fitted with leg braces and crutches. They were bulky and heavy, but liberating. For the first time in my life, I was able to walk more than two metres without needing to rest.

I was then informed that I was starting school the following week. I couldn't comprehend this new concept as I was raised to believe school was not a place for me. I remember picking out my clothes, folding and unfolding them, and packing my school bag with my new pencil case and binder that I insisted on buying. I was beyond excited, but nervous at the same time because I didn't know what to expect. I just knew I belonged there.

Monday finally arrived. I combed my hair, brushed my teeth, and changed just as I had always done in Somalia. But something was different about this day. Today I was finally going to start school.

I climbed into the back of a taxi that the school sent. We didn't drive for long but it felt like eternity. My heart was about to jump out of my chest.

When I got to the school, I found out that I had been assigned a special education teacher. Her name was Lisa. She was just as excited to meet me, and her smile calmed my nerves. She helped me find my new class and introduced me to my teacher, Ms. Pat.

At that moment, I looked around as I saw five multicolored round tables with four plastic chairs each. There was a fish tank, a blackboard at the front of the class, and letters on the wall. There were children's drawings displayed on the walls and a rocking chair in the corner where Ms. Pat sat during story time. Ms. Pat guided me to a blue table, the one nearest to her desk. There were labels with letters on the table, and she pointed to one. "Safia," she said, pointing at me. At that moment I realized that spot was created for me. I finally had a seat at the table, and it didn't matter that I had a disability or that I was a girl or a refugee.

Every child that is paralyzed from polio is one too many. Polio will rob them of their childhood, they will be forced to watch from the sidelines as they will continue to be excluded from buildings they belong in and they will miss out on life's simplest joys like scoring their first goal in the game of soccer.

We have come a long way in the fight against polio. Before the <u>Global Polio Eradication Initiative</u> started in 1988, the disease paralyzed more than a thousand children a day. We are close to the finish line, but the case in New York, where polio was eradicated more than 30 years ago, is a sobering reminder that polio is just a plane ride away and until every child is immunized, polio will continue to be a threat to every child.

### How Rotary members are fighting against polio

otary members have been

at the center of the worldwide effort to eradicate polio for more than three decades. Rotary launched PolioPlus in 1985 and helped found the Global Polio Eradication Initiative in 1988. At that time, wild poliovirus paralyzed hundreds of children every day, with an estimated 350,000 polio cases across more than 125 countries in one year. Since then, cases have plummeted more than 99.9%, sparing more than 20 million people from paralysis.

But as recent polio detections have revealed, polio remains a threat everywhere as long as it exists anywhere. In the days and weeks leading up to World Polio Day, 24 October, Rotary members around the world are holding events to raise awareness of the need to End Polio Now. Below are a few of those efforts.

#### Australia: Ride the train to end polio

Mark and Dave Anderson, members of the Rotary Club of Beecroft, will travel the entire train system in Sydney, visiting more than 189 stations on 24 October in an effort to raise funds and awareness for End Polio Now. They have conducted the challenge each of the past four years, raising more than \$450,000, matched two to one by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. Their goal this year is to raise another \$200,000. You can help out by riding the train with the dynamic duo if you are in Australia, or by visiting their challenge page.

#### Japan: Decorated buses

Rotary members in District 2630, Japan, worked with local transportation companies to decorate buses with End Polio Now colors. They used red (a color in the EPN logo); purple (the color



used to mark the little finger of children who receive the polio drops during immunization days); and yellow (the

color of vests warn by vaccination volunteers). In addition, End Polio Now appears above the entrance of the buses.

#### Korea: Walking to end polio

Hwamun Park, a member of the Rotary Club of Incheon Sinsegae, has been carrying an End Polio Now flag along the Camino de Santiago, a network of pilgrimages leading to the cathedral of Santiago de Compostela in Galicia in northwest Spain. As a hiker, completing the pilgrimage has been on her bucket list. A fellow



Rotarian offered to donate a dollar for every mile that Park walked. She walked more than 1,000 miles between May and July, talking to many people she met about Rotary's top priority. "Integrating Rotary's initiatives with what you want to do in life, that's how Rotarians live," Park says.

#### France: Marathon



Michel Porhel, a member of the Rotary Club of Laval Ambroise Paré, is planning to repeat his 2019 fundraising effort, when he competed in the Marathon des Sables, raising €5,000 (roughly \$4,800) for polio eradication. On 21 April, he will set off on the 240-kilometer event (about 150 miles) with an even more ambitious fundraising goal,

supported by members of his club and other Rotarians in District 1650.

### Austria: Ultra Cyclist raises \$1.2 million

Eleven days, six hours, 45 minutes. That's the time it took Kurt Matzler, a member of the Austrian Rotary Club Innsbruck-Goldenes Dachl, to cycle 3,000 miles across the United States during the Race Across America in June, raising \$1.2 million for End Polio Now.

Matzler finished sixth among individual cyclists and crossed 175,000 feet of elevation change, with temperatures up to 122 degrees Fahrenheit in the Mojave Desert. He only allowed himself four hours rest a day. Matzler, who has completed the same race previously with cycling teams, had a particularly rough time of it this go around, having to detour due to wildfires increasing the amount of elevation change, and facing both cold and wet conditions in the Rockies. He also overcame several bike repairs to complete his goal.





### THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community-always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

### THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardiode-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to

Service Above Self.
