Evaluation of RY 2022-2023

My assigned task for today is to give an evaluation of the now ending RY 2022-23. As I started my preparations, it dawned on me that there was a need to go into the meaning of the word EVALUATION, so as to be correct in relation with the task. It is imperative to contend with the meaning of the word. As my favorite mentor always puts it, to give appropriate context.

The dictionary definition of EVALUATE, give the following: (1.) To determine or fix the value of; (2.) To determine the significance, worth, or condition of- usually by careful appraisal and study. What seems to be missing, in the definition is- to whom the evaluation must be contextualized with. Allow me to volunteer that our evaluation today must be along the interest of our esteemed RCBaguio members. As such, we must center on the value, significance, and worth of what we the members of the club can appreciate from the accomplishments of the year.

To obtain information for my evaluation, I have taken the initiative of collecting reports for the year. May I be allowed to thank Club Secretary-PP Baby Kaur and Pres. Ali Morales, for providing us with the data.

My evaluation will be divided into six parts: Part 1- Club Admin, Part 2- Club Membership & Dev, Part 3-Public Image, Part 4- TRF, Part 5- Service Projects, Part 6- Comments & Endorsements; and end with my Final Statements.

PART 1- CLUB ADMINISTRATION: As the year ends, dues collection has been charted at 83% which is generally good, with only 9 members having unpaid balances. SAR/PRM/GOV obligations have all been fully paid. Report submissions to the District has been charted at a sterling 100%. Attendance in meetings has surprisingly been reported at 84%, adequately within the low 75% targeted in our District. Our overall performance on Club Admin should be evaluated as Very Good.

PART 2- CLUB MEMBERSHIP AND DEVELOPMENT: A truly notable accomplishment for this year is how we have been able to

rebound on the matter of our membership. In 2018, we had 50 members in RCB. Down on the next year to 46, further down to 41 in 2020, and 39 members as Covid19 wrecked havoc on us in 2021. This Rotary Year of 2022-23 will see us close with a total membership of 52 Rotarians; with a total of twelve new members inducted this year, adequately satisfying the 6 recruits idealized by the District. Club Membership now notably exceeds the 50 headcount we had in 2018. Membership Retention has been excellent at 98%. Our male to female ratio is at 28 men to 24 women. Our overall performance for Club Membership & Development, should likewise be evaluated as Very Good.

PART 3- PUBLIC IMAGE: The FB page and club website mandated by the District have both likewise been adequately complied with. Our Canao club bulletin has, to date, published a total of 39 issues. It is notable that we have finally been able to dovetail the publication online of our Canao and our rcbaguio.org website. The mandate on having a Club History, which we can showcase to the public, has also been filled. Our overall performance with respect to Public Image should again be evaluated as Very Good.

PART 4- THE ROTARY FOUNDATION: This year marks a landmark Giving of \$21,308 US Dollars. Notably almost equal to the combined contributions from our three most recent years from 2019 to 2021, totaling \$21,551 US Dollars. As such, Very Good must be the only correct evaluation on our TRF performance.

PART 5A- SERVICE PROJECTS A: Our Seven Areas of Focus have continually been reconciled with respect to our initiatives in the club. Our Rotaract Projects as well as our Vocational Projects have been sustained in these recent months, as well as our Scholarship Program. The most attended activity for this year seems to have been the Christmas Gift Giving to our school children that happened at the Burnham Onjon Park last December. Together with our Korean friends we also had our donation of wheelchairs to lucky indigents and laptops to our teacher beneficiaries. Our overall performance for Service Projects A should be evaluated as

Very Good.

PART 5B- SERVICE PROJECTS B: Under this heading, we include our TESDA Training Recruitment, Women's Touch in Action with our RCC. We had a Medical Mission conducted at Abanao Square. This has been complemented with our Supervised Feeding Program and Mothers Education on Health and Nutrition, punctuated by our Anti-Cervical Prevention Initiative for this year. Our overall performance for Service Projects B should likewise be evaluated as Very Good.

PART 6- COMMENTS AND ENDORSEMENTS: As stated in my beginning, this evaluation must center on what we, the members can appreciate of value and significance in our organization from what we have done during the year; centering on what can be improved, in relation with our members' interests in the club. The following are my three personal pet peeves. We trust that these sentiments will be shared by many members of the club, particularly those who are less vocal than us.

- 1. All members must fully settle their individual accounts as the year ends. My respectful endorsement is that those who cannot must seriously consider resignation at their own volition; if they are unable to pay their financial obligations to the club, as it is among the most basic tenet for membership in the organization. I know this is strong, but this is certainly something that needs to be said.
- 2. The Attendance Requirement in our club meetings has metamorphosed into what I now describe as a gray area, with respect to being mandatory for continuing membership. I am personally aware that there are a few new members who have attended just one, two, or three meetings after being inducted. My respectful endorsement is for our next leaders to create a methodical system of attendance assessment, which can be used forthwith as firm basis with respect to member confirmation. The gray system that pervades on Attendance simply cannot continue.
- 3. RCB GROUPINGS for Monthly Assignments. This is the continuation of the system created previously towards systematizing our club operation towards allowing better member involvement in club activities. Based on our online chat via FB Messenger, the majority of our members seem to have voted positively towards the continuation of the system. The

RCB Groupings we now have can probably be considered as an improvement in our system of club operation. But alas, it remains wanting on certain points because of the lack of cooperation among a few. My suspicion is that there are those who want a re-structuring of our teams because they think they will end up in a team with better-committed members. My respectful endorsement is to solicit a pledge from those who have been delinquent for their promise, to be more conscientious with their assigned tasks next Rotary Year.

FINAL STATEMENTS

In fairness, it must be said that the two previous Covid19-affected Rotary Years, should be given appropriate latitude due to the lack of member participation during those difficult months when all were mandated to remain indoors or only allowed restricted mobility. The accomplishments achieved this year should be graciously reconciled with as a new beginning that subsequent administrations of our Rotary club can draw inspiration from.

The President for any year is always recognized for the accomplishments achieved during his presidential stint. However, it must be said that our President relies on the support he is given by the RCB Board, and much more so by the individual Rotarians of our club. Thus, the success of a president will eventually be reconciled with the level of support he is able to muster and influence from the members of our organization.

Earlier, my intention was to close this evaluation by giving a numerical percentage rating. But I relented. For there is this new school of thought, among experts in the education sector that giving numerical ratings to students is now passé. And that the newer, more positive trend is to give generic ratings (such as poor, fair, good, very good, and whatever) where numerical competition among those concerned will be less pronounced.

As such, allow this evaluator to now give our closing Rotary Year of 2022 to 2023, a descriptive-assessment rating of Very Good or Superior or Excellent.

Kudos to Pres. Ali Morales, Secretary/PP Baby Kaur, our RCB Board, and to all our members for the success we have attained. Please join me in giving a resounding round of applause to ourselves, in our Rotary Club of Baguio.

In beginning of June 2022 Father Many Flores contacted me because he had a problem of supply of water to Kabayan Poblacion, including an elementary school & the Parish church, Benguet state.

On June 9, 2022, PP Bert and myself went to Kabayan, as we had the experience of the Matching Grant of the water system of Luding, to have a meeting:

RC Baguio: PP Gerard Audineau & PP Bert Talco (Civil Engineers)

Parish Church: Father Many Flores

Poblacion Barangay Captain: Captain Ervin Burisan

Poblacion President of the Water Association Rito Deban

La Trinidad Water District: Three water Engineers

We came back with a good idea of the works to be done, and a quantitative of the furniture to be bought, prepared by the engineers of La Trinidad.

As PP Chris tall us that he was interested to learn about Global Grant, I asked him to be the third member of the GG Committee, and been the chairman of the committee as he is the best us us with Internet for the contacts with TRF.

I contacted my friend PDG John Rowe, member of our sister club RC Port Pirie of District 9510. PDG John Rowe agreed to be our International Partner for the GG, and tall us that his District will give USSD 15,000.

PP Chris contacted Gov. Yu Dai Bong, member of RC Wonju, District 3730. We had a meeting with Gov. Yu Dai Bong who promised to give USSD 8,000. PP Chris contacted Gov. Ann of D 3790, who appreciated the subject of our GG ad gave a first agreement for USD 5,000.

Therefore, our committed sent our brief proposal on September 2022, and the final application on November 2022.

We had a lot of exchanges of mails with Rtn. Annie Shin, in charge for TRF of screening the proposals for GG, before to send it to the Committee for approval of GG. We had a lot of works, with the precious help of Father Many Flores who prepared well the answers to be given to Rtn. Annie Shin.

We recognize that it was very useful as the approval from TRF was given in few days, on May 31, 2023.







THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community–always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardiodeheart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to

Service Above Self.
