

5. Final meeting with the Principal and PTA of Baguio Central School - TBA


Today, let us lend our ears to our very own PP Chris Faelnar and hoping that we will be enlightened with our project thru the grant.





SLU IE Orientation about Rotaract Club

**T**his International Women's Day, 8 March, the Membership Development team at RI produced a webinar on the future of women in leadership. As I researched the issue, I read an article about women's place in the global economy and their challenges in achieving gender equity. The UN estimates it will take up to 286 years to close gaps in legal protection and remove discriminatory laws and 140 years for women to be represented equally in positions of power and leadership in the workplace. But despite these challenges, the panelists remained hopeful.

Manjoo Phadke, [recipient of the 2023-24 Sylvia Whitlock Award](#), spoke about empowering women to realize their potential rather than just handing them power. She believes that winning this award gives her one more tool to inspire confidence in the women around her and encourage them to lead.

Angela Walker, who has held leadership positions at both the club and district levels in Rotary, talked about the challenges women leaders face and the importance of perseverance. She said women need the strength not to let roadblocks discourage them from becoming who they want to be as leaders. Aja Castillo, the panel's moderator, emphasized the importance of allowing women to hold positions of authority and supporting them in navigating those tricky spaces.

Throughout the webinar, the panelists offered practical suggestions for supporting women in leadership – from mentoring and sponsoring to being a good ally. They stressed the need to understand the difference between equity and equality and to step back so others can step forward.

Reflecting on what I learned from the webinar, I'm reminded that we all have a role in advancing gender equity – regardless of gender. Whether learning more about the issues facing women or using our voices to speak up for their advancement, we can all make a difference.

Before diving headfirst into networking, define your purpose. Are you seeking mentors, collaborators, or simply friends? Identifying the specific types of people you want to connect with will help you target your efforts and build mutually beneficial relationships.

#### 2. Be a Platform, Not a Parasite:

Instead of focusing solely on what you can gain, offer value. Share your expertise, skills, and willingness to help. Contribute actively to your club, participate in service projects, and become known for your positive contributions. When you offer value, the right people will naturally gravitate towards you.

#### 3. Look Beyond Rotaract Events:

While Rotaract events are valuable, don't limit yourself. Attend workshops, conferences, and other events

related to your interests. This will expose you to like-minded individuals who share your passions.

#### 4. Build Relationships, Not Just Contacts:

## THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

## THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to
