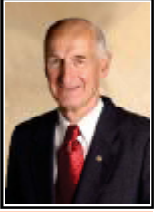
THE ROTARY CLUB OF BAGUIO LOGO

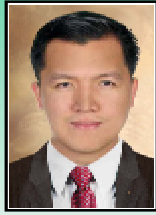
After the singing of Pilipinas kong Mahal, the fruitful meeting came to an end at 2:30 PM.

GHS'S PROFILE

MOST REV. FLORENTINO F. CINENSE

DD, Ph.D., SThL, Bishop of Tarlac
District Governor, District 3790, RY 2006-07

The most Rev. Florentino F. Cinense is the much-loved Bishop of Tarlac. To us Rotarians, he is fondly called "Governor Bishop".

He was born to Mariano Cinense and Ma. Consuelo Ferrer on March 14, 1938 in Guimba, Nueva Ecija. He finished his elementary education at Our Lady of Sacred Heart Academy, Guimba, NE (Salutatorian 1952); high school at Mary Help of Christians Seminary, Binmaley, Pangasinan (Valedictorian 1957); Licentiate in Philosophy, UST (Cum Laude 1960); Licentiate in Theology, UST (Cum Laude 1964); and Doctor of Philosophy, Angelicum University, Rome, Italy (Magna Cum Laude 1973).

He was ordained as a priest in 1963 and became the first Bishop of San Jose, NE in 1985. By 1988, he became the second Bishop of Tarlac. As a Church Leader, Bishop Cinense founded the following schools; St Rose of Lima Catholic School (Sta Rosa, NE 1981), Our Lady of Peace College Seminary (Tarlac 1989), Our Lady of Peace Formation House (QC 1992), San Sebastian Cathedral School (Tarlac City 1992). Our Lady of Ransom Catholic School (Tarlac City 1998), Gerona Catholic School (2000), and Victoria Catholic School (1988). He was also co-founder of the Missionary Catechists of the Holy Spirit (Gerona 1991) and the Servants of the Risen Christ Monastic Community (Ramos Tarlac 1998).

He was inducted into the Rotary Club of Tarlac on November 29, 1988. He has served the club as Director for Community Service (1989), Club Chairman-Disaster Relief Operations (1990), Director-Vocational Service (1993), Vice-Chair – Sisterhood Operations Pact with RC Chang Hwa Taiwan (1993) prior to being elected as President-Elect of RCT as well as the Director of Club Service and member of the Editorial Staff. He served as President during the Club's 50th year, thus earning him the title "Golden President". He is a multiple Paul Harris Fellow and has served as GSE Leader to Finland in 1999.

He is also presently serving the people of Tarlac as a member of the following organization/councils: Board of Director of the Red Cross-Tarlac, Provincial Peace and Order Council, and the PNP Enlistment Screening Committee.

His election as District Governor for RY 2006-07 earned him a place in Rotary history, being the first Catholic Bishop to become a District Governor worldwide. This is feat worthy to cap his ascend to this distinguished position from serving his club as President on its 50th year, to becoming the 6th Dist. Gov. from the Rotary Club of Tarlac on its 60th year of service.

Gov Bishop is a true gentleman, a humble servant of God, and a dynamic servant leader in Rotary. Truly, he is a blessing to Rotary.

Making Up is Hard To Do

When Rotary International introduced the then-new format of Make-Ups for attendance, the idea was to enable Rotarians to have a longer timeframe (two weeks) in which to do their Make-Up for an absence from the club's weekly meeting. The thought behind this was probably to encourage more members to really do a "make-up" for an absence.

Further to this, what was considered a make-up attendance was enlarged; to include such things as making-up in another club's meeting, joining club activities, joining club committee meetings that the Board of Directors considered important, etc.

The Net Effect has probably shown a much higher percentage of attendance – not only by the individual member but also the club's general average attendance percentage – and by default, the entire District's attendance percentage as well.

While Rotary International has not changed the objective of 60% Home Club Attendance by a member, I wonder if indeed this is being followed when a club or Rotarian claims a 100% attendance rate. We seem to be more interested in the overall percentage and (perhaps) conveniently forget to make sure that at least 60% of attendance was indeed with the "home club" – at the home club's regular meeting. There seems to be a gray area in Rotarian's minds of whether attending a club activity or committee meeting IS considered "home club attendance".

A Make-Up is by definition, not attendance at a home club regular meeting. "All Rotarians are busy" is a common expression used – however, let us look at how this use of make-ups has affected our Club. We actually have less members attending our regular meeting; conveniently, many members DO make-up but it has had an effect on our regular meetings.

With only perhaps a little over half of the membership attending our weekly meetings, the fellowship is not the same. So many empty seats for our Guest of Honor and Speaker to look at and wonder whether it was worth speaking before our Club. It is difficult for committee heads to plan on seeing their committee members at the meeting to follow up on Rotary business. Less of our members really know what is going on in the Club because they don't hear all the announcements made during the meeting. The "aura" of the Mother Club is just not the same.

How we have changed in just a few years! Once upon a not too long time ago, we would attend the regular meeting AND join in the Club activities. AND attend committee meetings. AND when we needed to make up, we would try and do it in another club. We would make time for Rotary. Because we considered it important, because we enjoyed the fellowship, because we wanted to.

What is so special about our Club? Aside from the fact that we are the oldest club in the District..? Our fellowship during club meetings. Our ability to keep Protocol in mind during the course of the meeting. Our interesting speakers. We learn something new every meeting. We learn more about how exceptional our individual members are, when we sit with them and join various conversations that go on. We can stand proud of the club's accomplishments in the various Avenues of Service. Proud – that's the word. It is something that develops over time and begins with our weekly club meeting.

Many clubs and other Rotarians have a different perception of what the Rotary Club of Baguio is. Read the last paragraph above again. If they joined our meetings, they too would see how and why we have been able to survive 68 years as a Rotary Club. So, if we are proud of our Club – let us show it by attending our weekly meeting, supporting our Board of Directors in the various goals and objectives for this Rotary year as they *Lead the Way*. Let us make a real effort to spend some time together each week and grow our Club even stronger.

Making up should be hard to do because you REALLY wanted to attend the weekly meeting.
