

GUEST OF HONOR AND SPEAKER'S PROFILE

PURIFICACION S. SUANDING-MOLINTAS

Regional Director
DEPARTMENT OF TOURISM – CAR

Today's Guest of Honor and Speaker is a true-blooded Benguet Cordilleran sired by the late Gov. Bantas W. Suanding and by a descendant of one of Baguio City's and Tuba's original families named Elizabeth Suello. She was born and raised in the city of Baguio and attended the Belgian-run Saint Louis Mission Center where she was an honor student. As a student leader, she become the first Girl Scout City Mayor of Baguio City in 1976, was the Citizens Army Training (CATO Units Corp Commander of Saint Louis Girls' High School in 1976-77 and was awarded the GERARDO ROXAS LEADERSHIP AWARD.

While in college, she likewise wrote as an editorial staff of the Saint Louis University Sword and Shield, coveted several awards for outstanding leadership, was a consistent academic scholar and eventually graduated as "CUMLAUDE" with the degree of Bachelor of Arts major in Political Science. She further pursued her studies in law and graduated in the Dean's List and later on spent her time in family-owned realty business. In the early 1990s, she was a regular participant under the USAID- Agribusiness System Assistance Program which brought her to cut flower farms, orchards and agribusiness facilities like cold storage and laboratories in the Philippines and other Asian countries like Hong Kong, Thailand, Singapore, Malaysia and Indonesia.

She is married to Atty. Raul Molintas, former Governor of Benguet who completed his 9-year old term in 2004; blessed with a 20-year old daughter, Lady Charmaine and a 16-yr old son, Baron Ralf. As former First Lady of the Province of Benguet, she was deeply involved in women's livelihood projects which gave way to the establishment of the Benguet Livelihood and Productivity Training Center in Wangal, La Trinindad, Benguet and eventual construction of a Benguet Museum beside the Provincial Capitol. She has also served as Adviser to the Benguet Farmer – Trainees to Japan and the Benguet Entrepreneurs Association, among others.

While she was busy with public concerns, she managed to chart a career path of her own. In May 1998, she took the prestigious third level Career Service Commission Eligibility (CSEE) Examination conducted by the Civil Service Commission with about 250 other examinees from the Cordillera region where she was one among the only 5 examinees who passed. And on 16 June 1999, she assumed the position of Regional Director of the Department Tourism-CAR which she holds to this date. She is also a Career Executive Service under the CESO Board.

As Tourism Regional Director for the Cordillera Administrative Region, she has focused on the development of new tourism products in the region in cooperation with various private sector stakeholders such as tourism councils and tourism organizations and the local government units. Thus, many festivals have emerged such as the Baguio Tossed Salad Festival both of which recently celebrated its 6th year and the Benguet King Carrot Cake Festival both of which aspired to be candidates to the Guinness Book of World Records and which became inspirations for other destinations to vie for Guinness Book of World Record titles like the biggest Strawberry Cake of La Trinidad, Benguet, also a DOTfunded project. In 2005, the Department of Tourism -CAR spearheaded the new regional festival called "WOW PHILIPPINES, CORDILLERAS' BEST", the Young Ambassadors for Tourism Camp (YATC) and the new concept of the BENGUET ADIVAY which the Benguet Provincial Government began to sustain for 2006 and hopefully in all succeeding years. The succeeding year of 2006, saw the birth of the DOT-supported 1st UNOY FESTIVAL of Tinglayan, Kalinga. Today, Cordillera stands proud for its numerous festivals as engines of rural development and machineries geared towards the dispersal of economic growth from urban centers.

After each year of toiling in the government service, she has become the recipient of several distinguished awards and recognitions from the Philippine Military Academy, Philippine National Police, and several others. Just recently, she was adjudged as one of the "10 Gems of Baguio" by Lady's Choice- Philippines and has been nominated in the search for national government awards.

Despite all the travel – laden hardships and toiling in the Department of Tourism, God has blessed the director with many rewards. For 2006, she was sent to Seoul, Korea last August to participate in the 2-week WEDDING EXPOSITION then to Kota Kinabalu, Malaysia last 10-13 Oct 2006 as observer in the Brunei-Indonesia- Malaysia-Philippines East Asia Growth Area In-Country Level Workshop. And recently to the 2006 ASEAN Seminar for Tourism Officials in Beijing, China from 31 October - 15 November 06. All of which are within just four months.

In view of the increasing demand in the tourism industry, she has also been recruited as faculty member of Saint Louis University at the Hotel and Tourism Management Department.



DANIEL: I'm not by myself, I'm with you.


MIYAGI: To make honey, young bee need young flower... not old prune.

RI'S YOUTUBE CHANNEL MAKES ADDING VIDEO TO YOUR WEB SITE EASY

When Rotarian Jeffrey Ott wanted to share his club's mushroom festival with a wider audience, the professional photographer teamed up with another club member to compose a slideshow and upload it to YouTube, complete with original music.

"It provides a quick and easy format for clubs without requiring a lot of expertise or equipment," says Ott, a member of the Rotary Club of Hawks Prairie-Lacey, Washington, USA, of the video-sharing site. "We are trying to use it more. People tend to go to YouTube first."

Video is an indispensable tool as Rotary seeks to increase its membership among younger generations. Fortunately, it has never been easier to add Rotary-related video to your club's Web site.

Rotary International launched its own YouTube channel a year ago with two goals in mind: offering Rotary video content to viewers who may not be familiar with the organization, and providing free video content to Rotary club webmasters.

The YouTube channel supplements video on Rotary's Web site by providing Rotarians the means of embedding video onto their own sites. Rotarians, Rotaractors, and Interactors are encouraged to select from a growing collection of pieces from RVM: The Rotarian Video Magazine and from Humanity in Motion public service announcements. Plans include highlighting user-generated video.

The channel has also taken Rotary's message to new audiences by allowing users to post the videos on non-Rotary sites. The Peace and Collaborative Development Network site features an embedded video of the Peace and Conflict Studies program at Chulalongkorn University in Bangkok, Thailand.

RI's YouTube Channel has more than 450 subscribers and has received over 30,000 views. Comments have been overwhelmingly positive.



"We have had a positive feedback from our club members to the inclusion of the videos on our club Web site," says Andrew Shaw, of the Rotary Club of Northampton West, England. "By having RI videos readily and easily available on our club Web site, club members find it keeps them up to date and more aware about RI activities throughout the world and enables them to talk with more confidence about how RI supports communities and individuals both nationally and internationally"

"This is a great idea," notes Howard Pell, a member of the Rotary Club of Waterloo, Ontario, Canada, who has been making videos of his club's activities for a couple of years and posting them to YouTube.

ROTARY INFORMATION

EMBEDDING VIDEOS FROM RI'S YOUTUBE CHANNEL

Years ago, adding video to a Web site was a major challenge. In addition to the cost of equipment to capture and edit your own video, you had to choose between formats and hope that visitors to your site had the proper software installed to view it. Bandwidth limitations were also an issue.

But with the advent of YouTube and the increase in broadband connections, embedding video on a Web site has never been easier. Follow these simple steps to add a video from Rotary International's YouTube channel to your Rotary club's Web site or Rotary-related blog:

1. After you've found a video you would like, look for this box on the upper right: corner of the YouTube page



2. Click your mouse within the Embed field box, which will highlight everything in the box. Right-click within the field and select Copy from your browser's drop-down box. This will copy the embed code, which will look something like this:

3. Open the source code of your Web page, and use a Web page editing tool to paste the embed code into your page. Save the page and upload it to your server using a FTP client.

Many free blogging services such as Google's Blogger make it even easier to embed video into a blog. 
