

Africa's most populous nation, Nigeria, still remains the only African country that still has record of the polio virus reported within its territory. The other two countries with the virus are Pakistan and Afghanistan.

The WHO has affirmed that despite a 99.9% reduction of polio spread between 1988 and 2016, they were committed to ensuring that polio is totally wiped off the planet.

According to the UN, 27 children have been paralyzed for life by polio in 2016.

To show worldwide support and continually promote awareness on the global eradication initiative to End Polio, Cluster 1C under the helm of AG Karl Gabaen, spearheaded the October 24 motorcade event to celebrate World Polio Day. 


Facts about the Canao

Did you know?

- That the original name of the Club Bulletin was THE BAGUIO CANAO and the first editor was the late "P.W." Percy Warner Tinan (from an extent August 1938 copy published in the Canao in 1978 under the term of PP Jerry Salvosa).
- That the original cover of the Canao was designed by Rtn. Jody Alabanza in 1964. Innovations were introduced later.
- That the inclusion of candid pictorials was introduced by PP Galo Reyes when he was EIC.
- That the book binding of the Canao was introduced by Editor/Secretary Noel "Ozzie" Osborn in 1968. Earlier, book bound Canao was done individually and published in mimeographed an lino-typed form.
- That the first Editor after WWII was the late Rtn. Benjamin "Ben" Salvosa (father of PP Jerry Salvoa), followed by PP "Abe" Abellera.
- That in the early years, Canao publication was done every fortnight until 1968, when the late Rtn./EIC "Carding" Paraan made it weekly, printing the Canao in mimeographed form. This way, being a newspaperman himself, the news or articles were fresh.

The Doctor leaves angrily and comes back after several more days. Doctor: "My eyesight has become weak."


Engineer: "Well, I don't have any medicine for this.

Engineer: "Congratulations! You got your vision back!.


That will be \$500."
