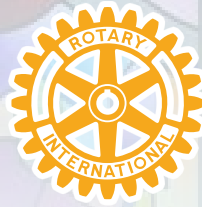
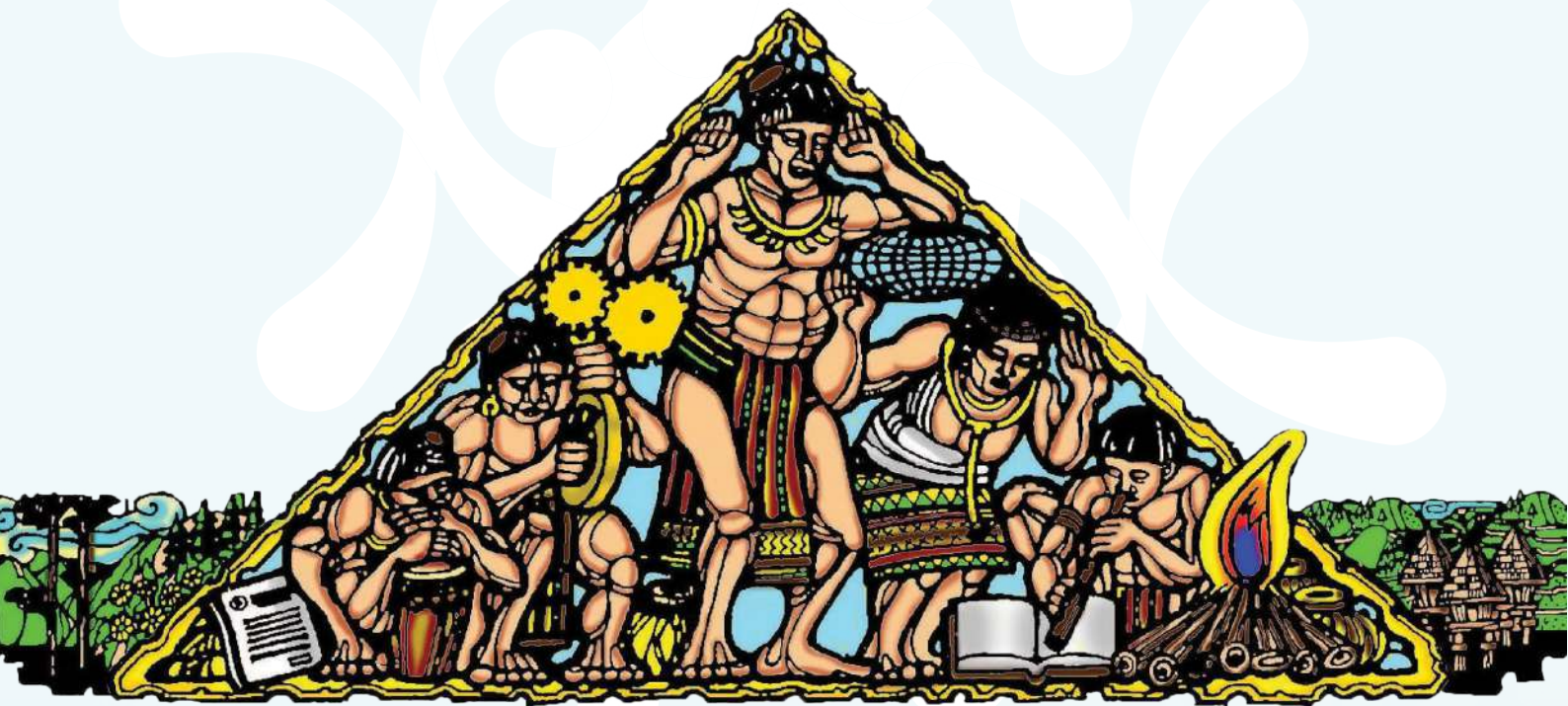

Reminiscing My Year (2007-2008) as RCB President

Editor’s Note: Your EIC has requested PP Raffy to oblige with a special Anniversary Article on his thoughts as past president. He has obliged, despite the very short notice.

To me, spending a year at the helm of the Rotary Club of Baguio, will forever be among the most important months of my life. My belief has it, that my presidency was fully relished—as twelve full months of personal dedication to the tasks at hand. For over a year, I was practically “on leave” from my architectural practice to give priority to my duties as Rotary President. I will forever be thankful that I had a fully supportive spouse, who understood the importance I gave to being RCB President.

To this day, I recall that my acceptance speech included an explanation, that as part of the Last Classical Section in SLU Boys’ High School, we studied the Latin language for four years. Thence, my presidential endorsement was for an RCB Club Motto to be instituted, in the form of a Latin axiom: “Respice, Adspice, Prospice.” Which literally means: “Look to the past, look at the present, and look to the future.” Until today, we continue to have this contextual inference as we talk about— RCB’s dynamism towards the future. Please watch our 2020 RCB Anniversary video again, particularly the last three minutes, in order to readily appreciate what I mean.

Among the most important points I stress whenever given a chance to share advice among our club leaders, is the point to: “never re-invent the wheel.” During my presidency, I have made it a priority to institutionalize a management system which was intended to be passed on from one president to the next. It included a file naming system; a Registration system, in MS Excel, to

guarantee ease when RCB hosts a large affair; a raffle ticket printing system, also in MS Excel (still constantly used by PP Chris Faelnar); a system (still in MS Excel) for arranging seating at the head table—which automatically prints the table labels as well; Recognition and Certificate printing systems; and some other useful (computer-savvy) stuff.

But the above is just the “tip of the iceberg.” In the Canao collection for 2007-2008, one can appreciate the tabulated system (actually a time-bound Gantt Chart) on the schedule of activities programmed for the year. Plus an audited Financial Report to the club members which was published in our Canao club bulletin at the end of each quarter. It should then be said that all of these things are expected. Unfortunately, this is not being done anymore. If only our leaders put in their time (to learn from the past), doing what needs to be done could become easier. [I can email to any interested club leader, the complete PDF Canao Collection for 2007-2008, upon request.]

PP Bert Talco, who followed me as next RCB President used most of the stuff I gave him as he assumed office. But over time, most of the “goodies” have been lost and relegated into oblivion. Much to the disadvantage of our club leaders who have never been told of their existence. Or maybe never bothered to appreciate them.

Lest this article be misunderstood as intended to erode the effectiveness of anyone among our past presidents, such is not the intent. Allow me to give context, through words—on people’s differences: precisely why each one of us is called an individual. It is simply because we are all different. We should therefore expect a different management style as each new president assumes office.

Our duty as past presidents is to share our experiences. If we are able to give even just one useful nugget that our leaders can use; then what has been shared, through an article such as this, would not have been in vain.

Opportunity with a Responsibility

Each day that I wake up, I always feel blessed and grateful because of the privilege that was given to me. Being a scholar is an opportunity with a responsibility that if I'd be able to fulfill, it will surely have a good bearing to me not only now but also to my future. Aside from my family and friends, I also consider my scholarship as a great source of motivation because it keeps me going and it serves as a milestone leading me closer to my dream.



Another unforgettable experience I had was when I became the clerk for a month. I'm happy to capture memorable moments they had during their meetings. I saw that they really enjoy what they are doing and I also learned something after listening to the guest speakers. The people there are kind, genuine, and humble even if they already have their respective professions. They talk to me in a friendly and pleasant manner that's why I was able to enjoy and get comfortable around them. The experience exposed me to a different kind of environment and gave me a lesson that learning is not just limited in school, but interacting with other people outside as well.

Even though I am still a student, these experiences matter to me. At a young age, I realized the importance of focusing on my goals and doing my responsibilities as a student and as a youth. It is also important to continue learning and developing myself so that I'd be equipped in the future as I take another part of my life.

And most of all, the reason why I'm doing my best is to attain something in the future that doesn't only benefit me but the community as well.

Of course this won't happen without the Rotary Club of Baguio especially the people who dedicate themselves to the organization. Witnessing their efforts to serve the community really inspire me to do the same thing even in simple ways.

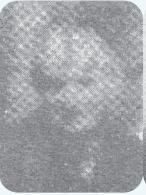

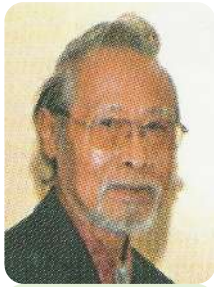

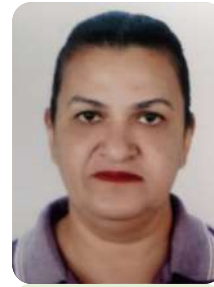

Object of Rotary

The Four-Way Test

2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL & BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?

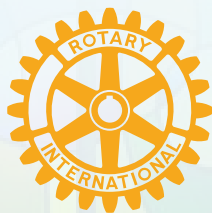
This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration— absorbed in ritual dance.

Rotary Club of Baguio

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club’s straightforwardness. Over-all

cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary’s Four-Way Test and the members’ commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to

Service Above Self.
