PP Diony introduced our Guest of Honor and Speaker, Dr. Manolo Flores whose topic was "Stroke Risks". Our Speaker is a certified Baguio boy. He is our very own young, handsome, well studied and intelligent Doctor.

According to our Speaker, "Stroke" is a disease of the brain and affects everyone- all ages. There is not cure for this disease but the same could be prevented. Stroke comes with a "strike" and it strikes immediately. There are warning signs and our speaker made sure that we understand and for us to act quickly. He summarized the warning signs as follows: BEFAST: B-for balance (cannot balance self); E-for eyes (lost vision of one or both eyes); F-face (becomes uneven); A- Arms (one hanging down); S- speech (trouble speaking, slurred); T- Time (Time is Brain..call 911/ immediately go to the hospital. Medical attention should be within 3 to 4 and 1/2 hours or else...

Many questions were asked and the members were fully satisfied with the answers given. Likewise, RAPP Louise Schlaaff thanked and acknowledged how our speaker cared and managed her during her time of illness.

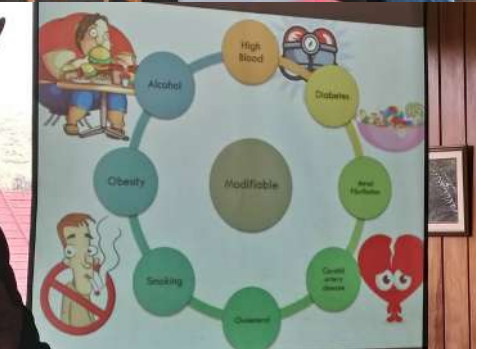
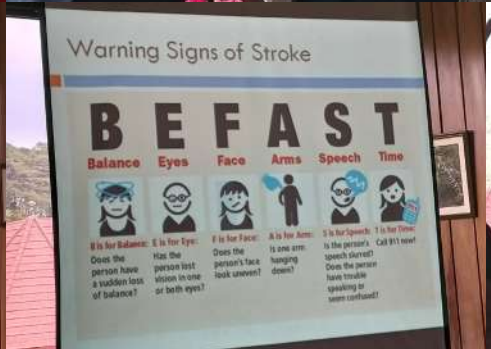
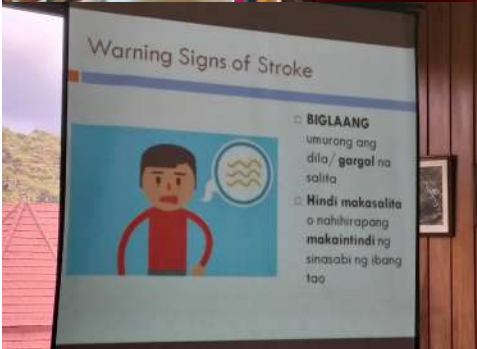

Dear Rotarians of District 7570:

This month's Rotary International theme is Economic and Community Development. Up until this past year, October had been our Vocational Service month, but the Trustees have moved that attention to January. We'll focus on our Vocations then.

So let's talk just a bit about Economic and Community Development, shall we? Often a discussion of Economic and Community development gravitates to our efforts in other countries. We mention Micro loans, providing long-term education for self-improvement, and increasing the capacity of community networks, just to name a few. All of these efforts are also available and needed right here in our own district, and we often overlook our local need for another that is far distant. If I have visited with you lately, you may have heard me say "Think globally, and act locally." This phrase – which I borrowed from Hillsville Club President Nick Fairhurst - captures this idea. I define our community as "our neighborhood, our region, or our world." It changes as easily as our conversations do. So let's focus on the community of our choice – located in an international time zone or located just down the street. All of our efforts and all of the Power of Rotary can apply to either location.

Think about it: Our relationship with local Chamber of Commerce; our involvement with mentoring our high school youth in mock job interviews and career days; our support of Regional Community Foundations like the Community Foundation of the Northern Shenandoah Valley; The Danville After Hours Club's program "Power of an Hour;" and my own club's work in Patrick County with a 90 acre community recreation facility are examples of local community development. All of these activities are just as valuable and important as our international work. Events like the Kapsowar VTT in 2014-15 and the upcoming Jamaica VTT in 2015-16 are just as powerful as any development here in the states. They stand side by side, and all of these activities produce impacts that are felt through our community.

Often I hear that Economic and Community Development is hard to define. Perhaps. But I don't see it that way. The idea here is to build the capacity and the self-confidence of entrepreneurs, of community leaders, of local organizations (Non Profit mostly), and increase the idea of NETWORKING as a GOOD thing. This does not have to happen in an impoverished location – it actually does not have to happen in any particular location. The title includes the word 'Development' – it does not say that we can only seek out a location that is below our personal living standards to develop. There is plenty of development to do wherever we turn, don't you think?

The next time you consider Economic and Community Development, consider this: we are 81 clubs strong. We are 3,400 Rotarians strong. We are 'persons of influence' and we make a difference in our world. De-fine the community of your focus and then formulate a plan to help improve its economic development and its community worth. It is easy if you try.

THE CAÑAO A Celebration of Service

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. “Cañao” (*pronounced as kan-yau*) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem (above) which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club’s members is represented by the dancing figures— in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do— in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community—always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of “A Celebration of Service.”

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club’s straightforwardness. Over-all cardiode-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary’s Four-Way Test and the members’ commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to

Service Above Self.
