


Sec. Cora featured the late PE NAAS






RCB PAYING MEMBERS 2021 - 2022

Rotary 2022 International Convention to be held in Houston

The event will bring more than 20,000 participants from around the world and deliver \$30 million in local economic impact

OUSTON (July 22, 2021) – During a joint news conference held at George R. Brown Convention Center today, Rotary and Houston First Corporation representatives announced that more than 20,000 service-minded people from around the world will gather in Houston for Rotary's 113th annual international convention on June 4-8, 2022.

The coveted international event is returning to Houston for the third time, marking the 50th anniversary of the 1972 international convention. The Bayou City also hosted the 5th Rotary convention in 1914. The event is expected to deliver \$30 million in economic impact for the city's hotels, restaurants, retailers and attractions.

"As a global membership organization that brings people from all continents and cultures together to share, learn and take action to bring positive and lasting change to communities around the world, we are thrilled that our first in-person international convention since 2019 will take place in Houston," said Rotary's International President Shekhar Mehta. "And for the first time ever, our annual event will be open to members of the public who want to connect, learn and be a part of our work to grow and change lives."

Rotary's 2022 international convention will transform the George R. Brown Convention Center into an energized hub and cultural mosaic as the organization's global network of volunteers gather to share information about all the ways they are taking action to address issues in their communities, to learn from notable experts, gain inspiration from world-class speakers, and connect with lifelong friends shaped through service.

Previous convention speakers include philanthropist Bill Gates; actor and philanthropist Ashton Kutcher; Prime Minister Justin Trudeau; actor, producer, host, entrepreneur, WWE Superstar and Rotary polio ambassador, John Cena; renowned primatologist Jane Goodall; and former United States Ambassador to the United Nations, Andrew Young.

Organized by Rotary International in conjunction with the <u>Houston Host Organization Committee</u> of local Rotary members, registrants of the convention will also experience Houston's hospitality with visits to local destinations like Space Center Houston, Kemah Boardwalk

and one of Houston's premiere shopping destinations, The Galleria. <u>Click here</u> to register for Rotary's International Convention.

"Houston and Houston First Corporation are thrilled to host Rotary's International Convention next summer," said Jorge Franz, Senior Vice President Tourism and Industry Relations at Houston First Corporation & Greater Houston Convention & Visitors Bureau's president. "We look forward to welcoming the thousands of awesome Rotary members who through their volunteerism and commitment to problem-solving make our communities better from continent to continent. This global exposure to 1.2 million Rotarians worldwide will further elevate Houston as a travel destination, and the anticipated \$30 million economic impact from the convention will be a financial shot in the arm for Houston hotels, restaurants, retailers, attractions and many more."

Houston Host Organization Committee chair, Rhonda Kennedy, representing 62 Houston-area clubs and its 2,400 members, said, "as a proud member of the Rotary Club of Sweeny, I am excited not only to welcome our fellow members from around the world to our beloved city, but also to show how Houston-area clubs are taking action to make the world a better place at home and abroad."

With the safety and wellbeing of participants and the wider community a top priority, Rotary's previous two conventions were held virtually due to the global pandemic. Speaking during the press conference, John Smarge, chair of Rotary's International Convention Committee, said, "this convention will also have a virtual component to make the event accessible to all members. And as we continue our planning, we will work closely with global and national health authorities to ensure that our in-person event follows the most current health and safety guidelines."

Awards Matter, But Not Why You Think

new business prospect asked me recently if I thought awards still mattered. Does anyone pay attention to them really? Instinctively, I answered "yes" for all the reasons we've been giving for years: awards build brand-awareness, differentiate you from the pack and help get you on customers' short-lists.

But on my ride home, I kept thinking about his question. We encourage and often help our clients chase award show glory all the time. It's a time-, resource- and budget-consuming effort, for sure. Some could argue that in this day and age, when content marketing and social media can do so much to get your story out there and let customers judge for themselves, does winning an award really make that much of a difference?

The answer is—even given all of that—yes, awards still matter. Before I detail why, let's agree that the kind of awards we're talking about aren't the bogus ones where you just submit a couple hundred dollars and get your name on a plaque. We're talking about the ones with qualified judges, the ones that your employees and customers would find admirable and cool.

Now, back to why they still matter:

Reason # 1: Awards instill a mindset of achievement.

It stands to reason you won't achieve greatness unless you strive for greatness. So creating a culture of doing award-winning work puts your people on the path to excellence. It pushes your teams to be more creative, go the extra mile, and deliver the best possible outcomes.

Reason #2: Awards nurture pride in your company.

Remember those old Monster.com ads that showed little kids saying things like, "When I grow up, I want to climb my way up to middle management." No one aspires to be mediocre and no one wants to work for a company that isn't the best at what they do. Awards are a way for you to recognize and celebrate the success of your company and its employees.

Reason #3: Awards showcase a focus on getting results.

Any awards program worth its salt will weigh business results above everything. To what extent has your team's work had an impact on your business or your customer's business – that's the bottom line. When your stats can speak for themselves, why not let them do their talking on as high a profile stage as possible?

Reason #4: Awards sharpen your sense of where the bar is and how to raise it.

Too often, organizations operate in a bubble, or only lift their heads up long enough to check out what the competition is doing to judge how they are performing. But there's a great big world out there, with many companies doing amazingly creative and innovative things. When you make the effort to measure yourself against the best of the best, then you'll know where you stand – are you a bar raiser or not?

Reason #5: Awards deliver that often hard-to-come-by third party validation.

Lastly, when you're part of an organization, it can be challenging to not find yourself drinking the corporate "Kool-Aid." Awards help you gain much needed perspective by letting an impartial third-party tell you how you are doing vis a vis your peers.

In short, awards are not about bragging rights; they are about testing your mettle and learning where and how you need to strengthen your products and services. It's about you and your teams knowing your work is award-worthy. And isn't that the only kind of work worth doing in the first place?



THE CAÑAO LOGO

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration—absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the community-always coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."

THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardiode-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to
