Mehta, an accountant, is chair of the Skyline Group, a real estate development company he founded. He is also a director of Operation Eyesight Universal (India), a Canada-based organization.

Mehta has been actively involved in disaster response and is a trustee of ShelterBox, UK. After the 2004 Indian Ocean tsunami, he helped build nearly 500 homes for families affected by the disaster.

He pioneered a program that has performed more than 1,500 life-changing heart surgeries in South Asia. He is also the architect of the TEACH Program, which promotes literacy throughout India and has reached thousands of schools.

A Rotary member since 1984, Mehta has served Rotary as director, member or chair of several committees, zone coordinator, training leader, member of The Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical Advisers, and district governor. He is also the chair of Rotary Foundation (India).

Mehta has received Rotary's Service Above Self Award and The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and Distinguished Service Awards.

He and his wife, Rashi, are Major Donors and members of the Bequest Society.



G. **GHS**: PP Cynthia F. Reyes

PP MIA introduced the Guest of Honor and Speaker, she started with the GHS' qualification to speak about MEMBERSHIP RETENTION for the club. PP Cynthia is also a Rotarian from RC Makati San Lorenzo and her current district position is DEPUTY District Coordinating Chair for Membership for the current Rotary Year.

PP Cynthia, our GHS started thanking PP Anton for recommending her to speak to one of the oldest club in the country, she acclaimed how RCB conducts its program and she was happy to know that members were involved in the preparation of the program and observed proper the protocols in the club. She also had a positive reaction for the Canao.

Her talk was about membership retention specifically a topic on keeping the member in Rotary, keeping Rotary in the member. She highlighted reasons why members of Rotary Club leave, according to statistics, 30% goes to cost and/ or time, 23% for club environment and 19% for unmet expectations. She also showed and explained what members want and the following was discussed:

- 1. Local community service
- 2. Friendship and fellowship
- 3. Professional development opportunities

Retention according to her presentation is critical to Rotary's ability to meet the growing demand for humanitarian needs and volunteer

services throughout the world.

There are 5 key tips for member retention namely:

1. Engage with them right away from the very start.

- 2. Take their suggestions seriously
- 3. Give them good resources
- 4. Crunch your numbers and
- 5. Perks

Our GHS also discussed how our club can adapt to change, she presented 7 new membership types created by clubs:

- 1. Family membership
- 2. Corporate membership
- 3. Young Rotary leader membership
- 4. Introductory membership
- 5. Trial membership or associate membership
- 6. Emeritus membership and
- 7. Friends of Rotary

She shared her story about her club and how they struggled to retain members and one of the best practices is the involvement of members in the activities at all times, making the club fun-loving, vibrant and fellowship activities in the clubs works to make members feel they belong to the club.

She also discussed new club models such as: traditional clubs, satellite clubs, e-clubs, passport clubs, corporate clubs, caused-based clubs and Rotaract clubs. She ended her talk with a message from Paul Harris: *"This is a changing world; we must be prepared to change with it"*.

QUESTION and ANSWER

1. PP Benny thanked the GHS for a well-prepared presentation and asked about the 30 percent not included in the statistics of why Rotarians leave the club. The GHS mentioned some other reasons such as geographic and the pandemic that made even her club was affected. PP Benny also asked if forming groups within the club such as cliques can also be a factor, the GHS mentioned that belongingness is an important factor in the club, if one is comfortable being with a group and contributes to the club's success, it should not be a problem.

2. Dir. Glen asked how is Rotary similar to ZON-TA (where the GHS is also an active member). The GHS mentioned that retention is also a challenge, she emphasized that leading such club is also different because all members are women and it is a different strategy and approach to leading women.

3. IPP Atom shared her experience also as a member of another group similar to Zonta in Baguio. IPP Atom attested that it is also an advantage to be a member of such group and bring in that attitude to Rotary Club, which is helpful and productive.

H. **RESPONSE**

- PP Alfred thanked PP Cynthia our GHS for the day, RCB learned a lot from her and encouraged the old members to remain active to promote friendship and accept assignments to guide new members of the club. He also encouraged everyone to adapt to changes specially now during the Pandemic, that we remain active and strong as a club.





Growing Rotary through membership leads

Editor's note: This is the second in a series of blog posts for Membership Month where experts share how they reach out to prospective members, keep existing members engaged, and create an environment that allows new clubs to form and thrive.

Doing something good in the Rotary world has always been my passion. The reach and access that I was afforded as an assistant governor in my district in India made it possible for me to reach my goals.

My endeavor to grow Rotary in my region began with an idea to revive our 52-year-old community based Rotaract Club of Secunderabad. It was chartered in April of 1968 and is one of the oldest Rotaract clubs in the world. Until the last few years, the club was slumbering with not much activity and not a lot of member engagement. We started at the top, revamping the leadership and bringing in passionate and active people. We were then able to induct 30 new members and discover ways to get them involved in voluntarily community services activities that they were proud to participate in.

Pursue membership leads

The membership leads which I received as an assistant governor greatly helped me in connecting with many young prospective members as well as some older ones, and students and entrepreneurs who were keen to learn more about Rotary. Once I followed up (always follow up on membership leads!), they wanted to be part of our great organization. One such extended interaction involved a medical student, Ms. Kaanthi Rama, who was studying to get her degree at Gandhi Medical college in Secunderabad. Getting to know her opened the door to many others she knew, and we were able to form the Rotaract Club of Secunderabad Medicos with about 70 members.

Rama, who became club president, was so inspired and motivated about Rotary, that she and her members decided to form a community based club instead of a university or college-based club so they could continue to serve Rotary even after they graduated.

Although Rama wanted to add more members from other medical colleges, I persuaded her to help form new clubs at other colleges. This resulted in two new Rotaract clubs – Osmania Medical College with 138 members and Apollo Medical College with 130 members. This added an astounding 350 new members to Rotaract for the first time in the history of our district.

Be persistent

I had a similar long and deep conversation with Ms. Bhuvansehwari, an engineering student in Hyderabad, who was looking to join Rotaract. After continuous follow-up discussions (always follow up your initial membership conversations), I was able to motivate her to form a group of like-minded individuals to form the Rotaract Club of Go-Getters with a membership of 25 young women, thus creating the first all-female Rotaract club in our district.


Chartering a Rotary club as a governor's special representative was a bigger task. But thanks to the great support I received from our membership chair, Srinivas Peddi, I was able to assemble 29 members in various professions, with an emphasis on having at least a third of them be women. It took three months of exhaustive conversations and motivational talks, but the result was the Rotary Club of Secunderabad New Horizon. (I chose that name to symbolize the new normal of the COVID-19 pandemic). It was the first club in nearly 20 years sponsored on behalf of my club.

I leave you with these thoughts. Use your connections in leadership to arrange talks with prospective members. Follow up on leads you receive. Motivate those people to get the people around them excited. And persistently follow through. It can be a fair amount of effort, but the satisfaction of seeing our organization grow and add new members is definitely worth it.

Take the <u>Online Membership Leads course</u> to learn how a prospective member experiences the membership leads process, and how club and district leaders can create a consistent, positive experience for prospective members.





THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

Our Official Club Bulletin has been called The Cañao. "Cañao" (pronounced as kan-yau) is actually the local term for the dance during native feasts or celebrations in the highlands of the Cordilleras- in Northern Luzon of the Philippines.

This is depicted in our Cañao emblem which shows a number of human figures in deep concentration absorbed in ritual dance.

The attention, focus, commitment and unity of the club's members is represented by the dancing figures—in celebration or expectation of a bountiful harvest; much as we actually do—in anticipation of the joy derived from public service to the communityalways coupled with fellowship. Hence, the sub-title of "A Celebration of Service."



THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardiode-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to

Service Above Self.
