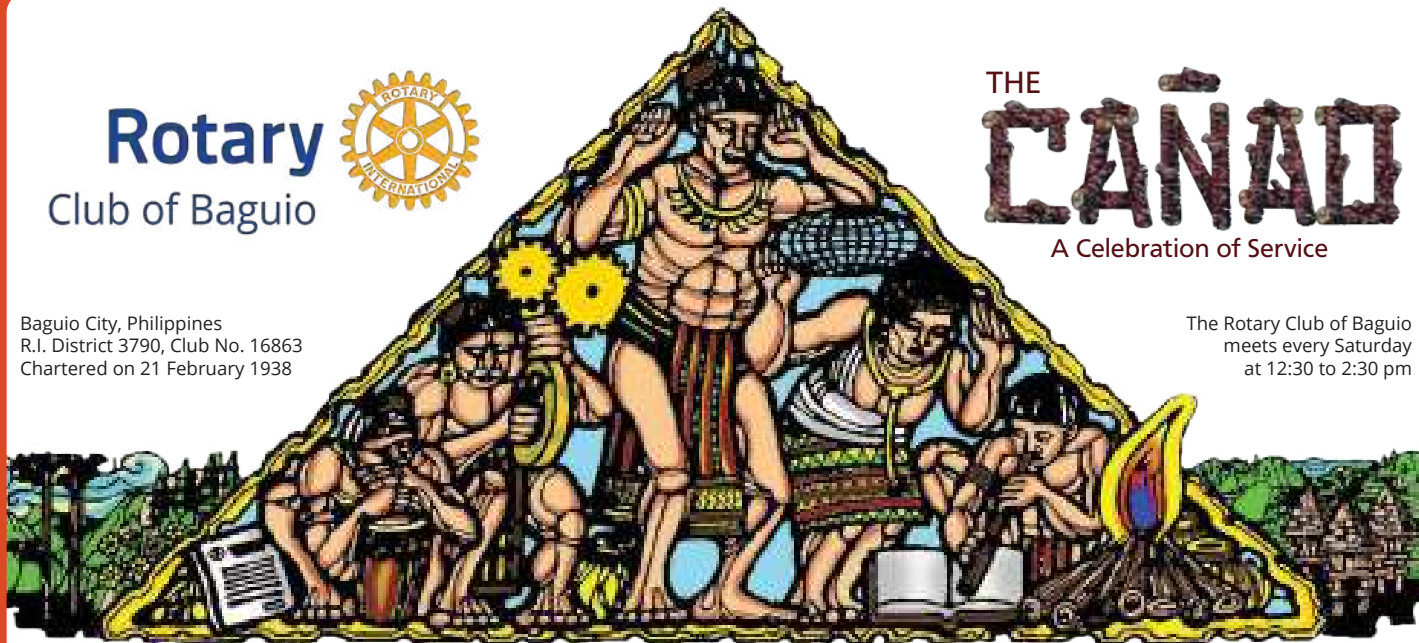

ROTARY DAY..... and it is an out-of-venue to experience what we call "GEMBA".... we go where the action is!

Our project 02: WATERHARVESTING SA BAGUIO CENTRAL SCHOOL will be properly launched today with the Baguio Central School officials including the PTA officers. This is a very interesting project because RCB as the oldest Rotary Club in District meets the oldest school in Baguio – the Baguio Central School.

WHY RAINWATER HARVESTING for PROJECT 02?

This started with a simple request from the PTA officer of the school, PP Chris F made an ocular inspection and saw the need of water supply for a population of 5,000 users (teachers, pupils, parents, staff, etc) of Baguio Central School. This started the idea of utilizing rainwater (to harvest) for cleaning the comfort rooms, watering the plants and others. This was first discussed with PP Yu, to the club and finally the district.

Initially the following donated money for the installation of the system:

1. PP Yu Daibong – Php 10,000
2. Joseph Kim – Php 10,000
3. Pres. Cora Ocampo – Php 5,000
4. PP Chris F – Php 5,000
5. ATreas. Ruth – Php 4,000
6. ALUMNI US – Php 6,000

The system was successfully installed, thanks to PP Chris F's skills in installing the pipes with the help of Dir. Reymund and Rtn. Eduard. Fortunately, the club received another Php 56,000 from the district to continue with the installation and to sustain the project for the next 2 Rotary Years.

LET US LEARN MORE ABOUT RAINWATER HARVESTING.

Rainwater harvesting is a sustainable practice that involves collecting and storing rainwater for various uses, rather than letting it run off into drains or rivers. It's an ancient technique that has been used for centuries in different parts of the world and has gained renewed interest due to water scarcity issues and environmental concerns.

1. Water Conservation: Rainwater harvesting helps in conserving water resources by capturing rainwater that would otherwise be lost as runoff. This is particularly important in regions facing water scarcity or where traditional water sources are depleting.

Reduced Demand on Municipal Water Supply: By utilizing harvested rainwater for activities like irrigation, landscaping, and even indoor use (with proper treatment), households and businesses can reduce their reliance on municipal water supplies. This can help alleviate pressure on water infrastructure, especially during dry seasons or periods of drought.

3. **Environmental Benefits:** Rainwater harvesting can contribute to environmental sustainability by reducing erosion, flooding, and pollution caused by stormwater runoff. By capturing rainwater, less water flows over impervious surfaces, picking up pollutants and carrying them into water bodies.
4. **Cost Savings:** Implementing rainwater harvesting systems can lead to significant cost savings in the long run. While there are upfront costs associated with installing and maintaining harvesting systems, these can be offset by reduced water bills and potentially lower landscaping and irrigation costs.
5. **Flexibility and Scalability:** Rainwater harvesting systems can be tailored to meet the specific needs and constraints of different locations and scales, from individual homes to large commercial or industrial facilities. They can range from simple, low-cost setups like rain barrels or cisterns to more complex systems incorporating filtration and treatment technologies.
6. **Community Benefits:** In addition to individual benefits, rainwater harvesting can also have broader community-level impacts. For instance, collective rainwater harvesting initiatives can help communities become more resilient to water shortages and foster a sense of local self-reliance.
7. **Regulatory and Policy Considerations:** Policies and regulations related to rainwater harvesting vary widely depending on local jurisdiction. Some areas offer incentives or rebates to encourage its adoption, while others may have restrictions or guidelines governing its use. Understanding the legal and regulatory framework is important for anyone considering implementing rainwater harvesting systems.

Overall, rainwater harvesting presents a holistic approach to water management that addresses both environmental and societal challenges. By capturing and utilizing a free and abundant natural resource, it offers a sustainable solution to water scarcity while promoting resilience and self-sufficiency at various scales.

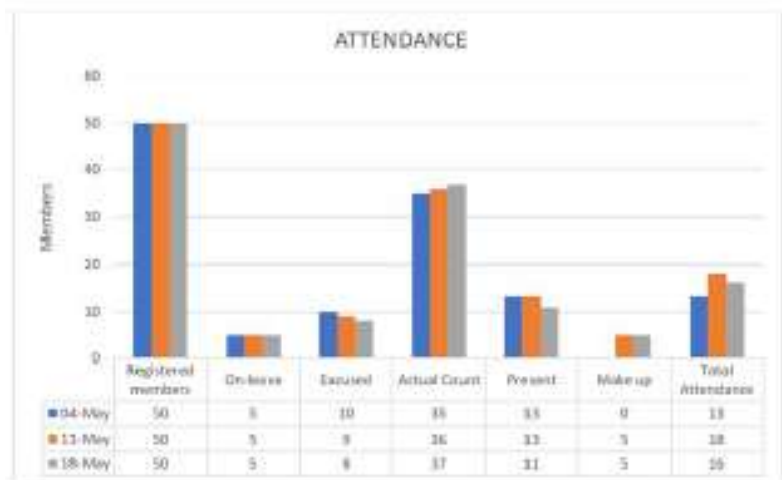

The Power of Connection: A Beacon of Hope for Ukraine

A beacon of hope arose from an unexpected collaboration between Rotary districts interested in responding to the crisis in Ukraine. Two years ago, as I sat with three of my district governor classmates at the Zone 28/32 Conference in Toronto, we began a dialogue that would set the stage for a remarkable journey.

Aware of the opportunity provided by The Rotary Foundation's Disaster Response Fund, we began to form the idea of pooling resources to maximize our impact. With the enthusiastic support of the district governors and Rotary Foundation chairs from Districts 6310, 6290, 7430, and 7980 we secured a grant of \$100,000.

Tangible results came quickly. With the grant, we purchased a mobile water filtration system, AQUASET-RO 1000, medical and dental supplies, and essential winter clothing, transporting it to Ukraine to help thousands in need.

The thermal clothing, in particular, proved invaluable in the harsh winter, providing comfort and protection to those enduring the bitter cold. Meanwhile, the water purification unit brought safe drinking water to villages between Mykolaiv and Kherson, benefiting thousands.

Borys Bodnar, a member of the Ukraine Unity Passport Club, attested to the significance of these efforts, emphasizing how the thermal clothing and water purification system were instrumental in sustaining communities through ongoing hardships.

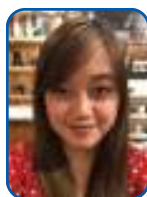
Tony Preston, the project coordinator, echoed this sentiment, acknowledging the undeniable success of the project, evidenced by the overwhelming demand for aid. While the exact number of lives touched may never be fully quantified, the impact undoubtedly spans tens of thousands, with countless individuals receiving crucial medical care and comfort during their time of need.

Through collaboration and unwavering dedication, our four Rotary districts came together to make a tangible difference in the lives of those affected by the crisis in Ukraine. As a public image champion for Rotary, I am excited to share this story of my small part because it testifies to the impact each of us can make through our connections in Rotary and the power of taking collective action.

Getting more out of Rotary Youth Leadership Awards

Missouri RYLA Academy has a saying, “Right person. Right place. Right time.” This was never more evidenced than in August of 2023 when a group of RYLA directors from around the United States, Canada, and Taiwan met to discuss all things “RYLA” and elevate programming to meet the next generation of RYLA leaders.

RYLA directors met for three days of training, networking, and high-energy fun. As usual with RYLA, friendships were created that will undoubtedly last lifetimes. But it wasn’t all fun and games.

The primary purpose of Nex Gen 2023, as the event was called, was to equip RYLA directors with the policies, procedures, and ideas to elevate their RYLA programs to greater heights for years to come. The first day of Nex Gen was about friendship. RYLA Directors met in a casual setting, made introductions, addressed training expectations, and began friendships.

Day two focused on training directors in the success of Missouri RYLA Academy. All attendees were given a detailed, 200-page facilitator guide. This guide includes complete steps on everything from staff selection and student selection to budgeting and capacity building.

Day three was go time! Attendees shared successes and horror stories with each other. Round-table brainstorming sessions resulted in innovative ideas. The training ended with upbeat, energized directors ready to apply new policies, procedures, and strategies to their own RYLA programs.

The event happened in typical Rotary fashion. Two highly successful RYLA programs met each other at the [Rotary International Convention in Hamburg, Germany](#), in June 2019. Both programs realized they had something the RYLA world needed and set out to bring RYLA directors together for fun, learning, and networking.

District 6760 RYLA from Clarksville, Tennessee, is based on a model of youth leaders developing future youth leaders. Mentoring, shaping, and molding future Rotarians in an intense week-long program. Missouri RYLA Academy is a multi-district RYLA, partnering Rotarian volunteers with professional school educators to implement a curriculum of Rotary servant leadership. Both RYLA’s are founded on two principles: the first is that youth are the most important ingredient in the future of Rotary, and the second is that if Rotary is going to invest time and money in youth through RYLA, it needs an immediate return on investment.

The return on investment for our event’s trainers, vendors, and attendees was huge! Programs were strengthened, networks were established, and friendships were forged. Based on overwhelming praise, we’ve decided to do it again on 14-16 August in Kansas City, Missouri. Learn more at www.nexgenryla.com





THE CAÑAO EMBLEM

THE RCB LOGO

The Rotary Club of Baguio (RCB) was chartered on 21 February 1938. The 4,587th member of Rotary International and the oldest club organized North of Manila; the 6th chartered Rotary Club in the entire Philippines.

Our over-simplified club logo (red) is a composite of the letters r, c & B; this is symbolic of the club's straightforwardness. Over-all cardioid-heart shape connotes that our members serve from the heart. The four basic elements (four quadrants— now 3D bevelled) are symbolic of Rotary's Four-Way Test and the members' commitment to it. Our charter year of 1938 is used as the mid-focal point of the logo, to emphasize our early beginnings and continuing dedication to
