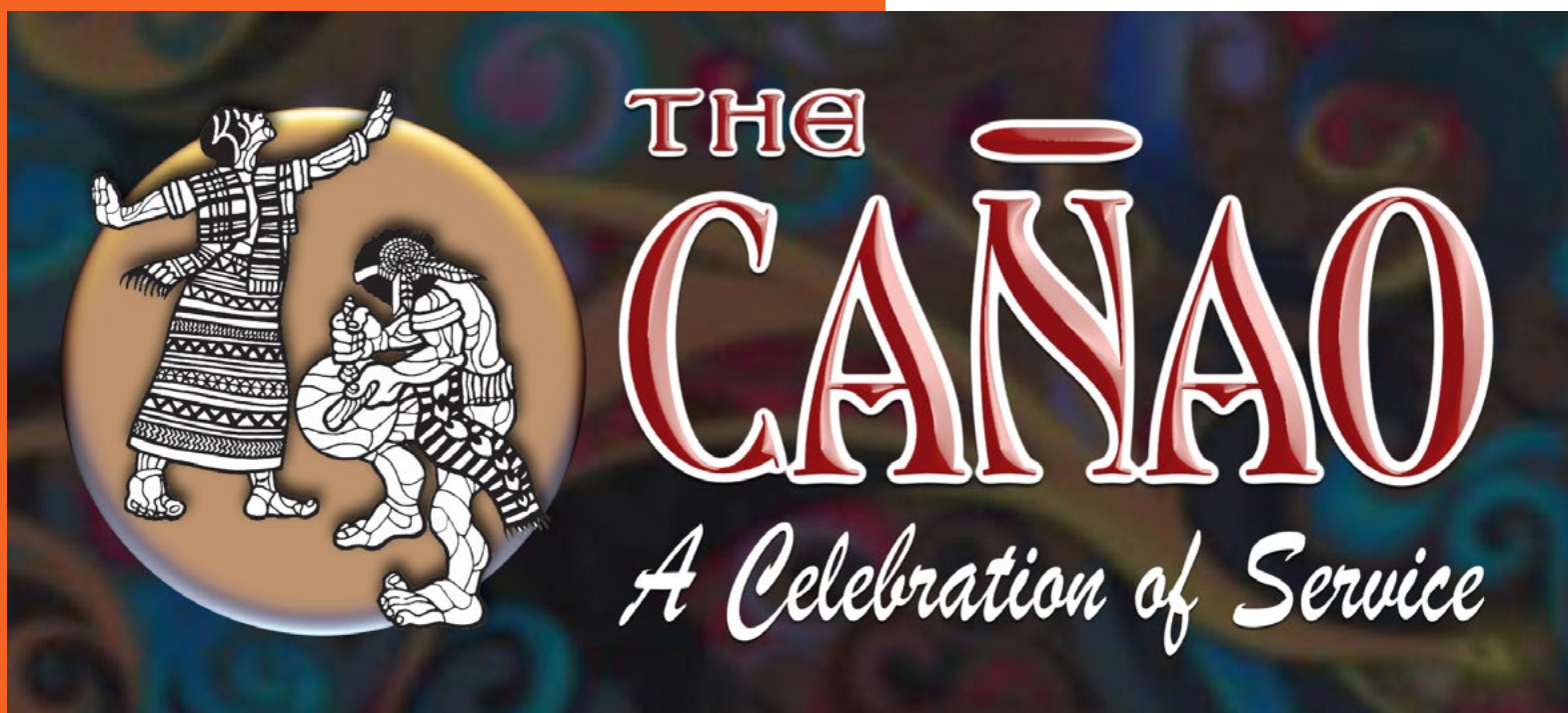

THE CAÑAO & NEW EMBLEM

Symbolizing unity, joy, and gratitude, “Cañao” (pronounced kan-yau) is a traditional dance from the Cordilleras in Northern Luzon of the Philippines, celebrated during feasts and gatherings.

Our new emblem shows a male and female in ritual dance within a native gong—honoring abundance, much like how we celebrate service and fellowship in Rotary. Truly, “A Celebration of Service.”



PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

ONE DOWN, 49 TO GO— STARTING STRONG

We've just completed our first week of Rotary service for the year—and what a vibrant and meaningful beginning it has been!

Last 05 July, we launched our Rotary year with a heartfelt community project held at the CDRRMO Building in City Camp Barangay: “Handog ng District 3790 sa Kabataan.” Through this initiative, 100 Child Development Centers (CDCs) in Baguio received essential cleaning materials to help ensure safe and hygienic classrooms for our children. It may seem a simple gesture, but its value was deeply felt by our young learners and their dedicated teachers. One CDC teacher expressed, “Maraming salamat po sa tulong. Malaking bagay ito para sa kalinisan ng silid-aralan ng aming mga bata.” (“Thank you so much for the support. This means a lot in keeping our children’s classroom clean.”)

Thanks to the unwavering support of our members, we completed this task with unity and heart. This is Rotary in motion—when we Unite for Good, we plant the seeds of lasting change in every community we touch.

That same day, we held our first “Unite for Good” Club Assembly, where our club chairs and board members laid out their plans across Rotary’s Seven Avenues of Service. I was deeply moved by the energy, thoughtfulness, and sense of direction everyone brought. We now have a clear roadmap for the year—thank you for your contributions and passion.

On 07 July, we carried that spirit forward with our club-led community project at the Loakan-Apugan Covered Court. This time, we honored the 13 CDC teachers under our wing. Each one received a First Aid Kit, made possible through:

- PPs Chris and Alfred, and IPP Susan, who sponsored and delivered the kits
- Dir. Eduard Ramos and Ann, for preparing and producing the project tarpaulins
- VP Lou Guzman, whose gift idea added a truly heartwarming touch

As President, I personally prepared small care packages containing multivitamins, alcohol spray, pain relievers, and pens—simple tokens of gratitude to say: we see you, we value you, we support you.

Rotary service didn’t stop there. On 03 July, PN Reymund represented us at the Induction of our Mother Club in Manila. On 04 July, PP Cora and IPP Susan joined the inauguration of Pres. Raio Bautista of RCB Summer Capital. That same day, I joined IPP Susan, PP Cora, and PP Chris Faelnar at the induction of RC Baguio North, where we witnessed the installation of Gov. Dan Torres and Pres. Jhay Ar Guron.

On 08 July, I had the honor of attending the Induction of Pres. Larry Sarito of our daughter club, RC Dagupan. And as I write this, I’m preparing for yet another induction, this time for our daughter club in San Fernando, La Union.

I may still be learning—taking baby steps—but I walk this path with a full heart, and with each of you beside me. Please forgive any missteps. Know that I am giving this my best, always anchored in our shared commitment to Service Above Self.

Let’s continue to Unite for Good—one week, one project, one purpose at a time.

Francesco Arezzo, a member of the Rotary Club of Ragusa, Italy, has been selected by the Board of Directors to become Rotary International's president for 2025-26. Arezzo became president last 01 July 2025.

The Board conducted a special session following the unexpected resignation of RI President-elect Mário César Martins de Camargo on 08 June. Guided by the RI code and policies, the Board selected the new president-elect from a pool of candidates who were considered by the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International in August 2023.

The 2025-26 presidential message, announced at the 2025 Rotary International Assembly in February, will remain **Unite for Good**, which calls on Rotary members to be a force for unity in a world increasingly divided by politics, geography, and ideology.

Arezzo is an orthodontist in private practice. He is active internationally as a member of the Italian, European, and American orthodontics associations. He is vice president of the National Association of Italian Dentists for the province of Ragusa and was the founder and head for seven years of the delegation for Ragusa of the National Trust for Italy. He is a Knight of Honor and Devotion in Obedience within the Sovereign Order of Malta.

A Rotary member for more than 30 years, Arezzo has served as vice chair of the Joint Strategic Planning Committee and as RI director, learning facilitator, and as district conference presidential representative.

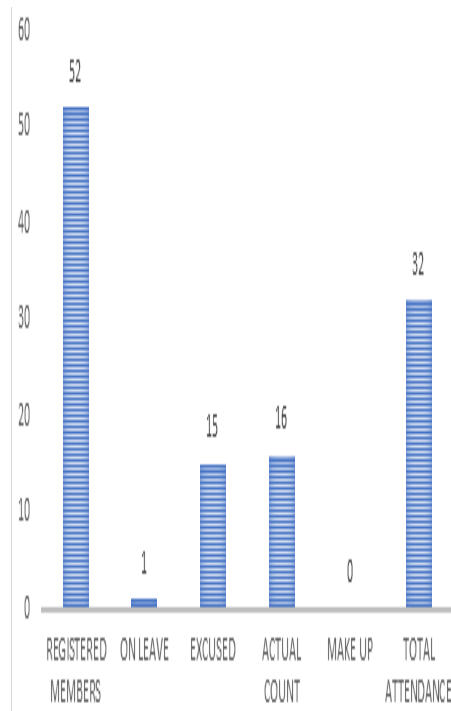

E – EIC Meditations: My personal corner — where I engage directly with you, dear reader.

F – Feature Page: Filled with helpful tips, ideas, and inspiring stories worth sharing.

Alongside these new elements, our Layout Artist Oli and I have made a key design decision — opting to use the **Calibri font** throughout, for its clean, slender readability. We found Helvetica a bit too bulky and not as reader-friendly across devices.

The middle letter of **Cañao** must always be spelled with the proper "ñ" — that familiar curl above the "n" is not just aesthetic, but essential. It's a point of pride, and I'm committed to preserving this as part of our editorial decorum.

We are keeping to our **European date format** — no commas, two-digit dates: e.g., 07 September 2025. Please extend your cooperation so we may preserve this consistency across all submissions.
