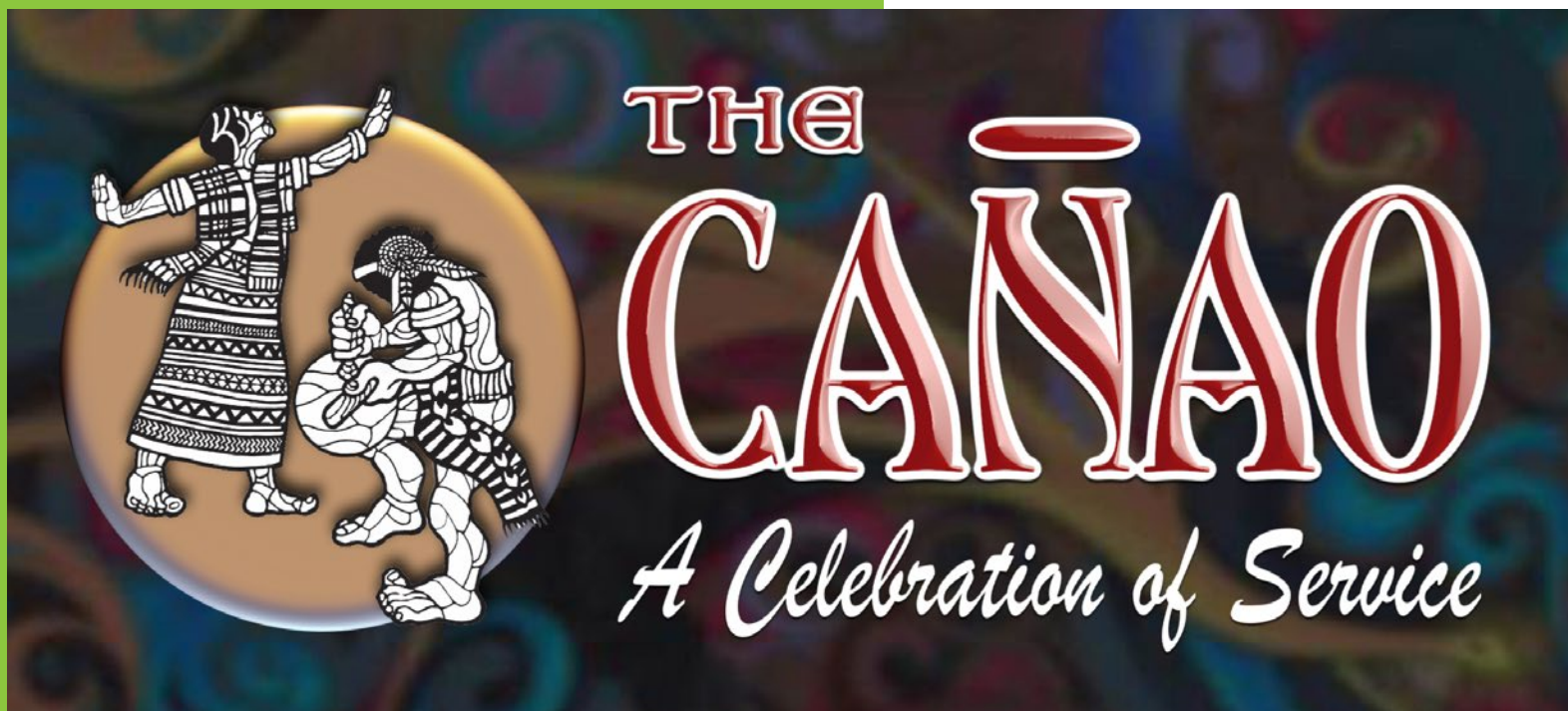

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

HONORING THE PAST, EMBRACING THE FUTURE

As I begin my term as the 83rd President of the Rotary Club of Baguio, I am deeply honored to lead our club into its 88th year of service. Ours is a legacy built on fellowship, strengthened by tradition, and sustained by a spirit of service that continues to inspire us all.

My own path in service began as a young medical student, joining MomFI outreach programs in the Cordillera to bring healthcare to remote communities. Later, during residency in Emergency Medicine at PGH, I was confronted by the stark divide between rich and poor in their access to care. As an Obstetrician-Gynecologist serving in both public and private hospitals, I have come to embrace the truth that every life—regardless of background—deserves dignity and compassion.

These experiences moved me to teaching, where for over 30 years at SLU School of Medicine, I have encouraged future doctors to practice with both skill and empathy. For 18 years as a Rotarian, I have been blessed to carry this mission further through medical missions and community work. Now, as I assume this presidency, I feel my journey coming full circle—uniting medicine, education, and Rotary service.

As a physician, my guiding principle has always been: “First, do no harm.” This aligns beautifully with our Rotary Four-Way Test, reminding us to seek truth, fairness, goodwill, and benefit for all. Both medicine and Rotary call us to live with compassion, integrity, and responsibility.

This Rotary year, my vision is threefold:

- Honor our past by continuing the projects and traditions that have

shaped our club for nine decades.

- Prepare for the future by empowering our youth—our Rotaractors and Interactors—whose energy and creativity are vital to our mission.
- Celebrate the present by living our service joyfully in the here and now, through fellowship, kindness, and unity.

I also wish to extend my heartfelt thanks on the recent Governor’s Visit. Our Board and officers welcomed Gov. Dan and his party (AG Liza, Treas. Fe Oyson and Exec. Sec. Nonnette Bennet) with warmth and preparation. Special thanks to Sec. Our senior members, particularly those officially "Excused" from attendance, embody this beautifully. Though they could rest on the privilege of their status, many still make the effort to be with us, contributing their time, wisdom, and warmth. Their quiet presence speaks volumes about what it truly means to belong.

It is therefore both ironic and concerning when some younger members—those without any attendance exemption—choose not to be present. This absence is more than missing a meeting; it is stepping away from the fellowship, the shared mission, and the very heartbeat of our Mother Club of RI District 3790.

A glance through our Membership Roster may prompt reflection: Who among us has not been seen for months? And more importantly—why? Rotary is not a name on a roster, nor a badge worn for prestige. It is an active embrace of service, camaraderie, and shared purpose.

When membership is held merely for the honor of association, we miss the deeper fulfillment Rotary offers. Let passive affiliation give way to genuine engagement—so that every member's presence, whether in meetings or in service, becomes a gift we give to each other and to the causes we cherish.

Our club thrives on the principle of Responsible Membership. True participation is not about fulfilling a schedule or responding to a coordinator's reminder; it is about personally valuing the time we spend together every

Saturday. Over time, private-messaging assigned participants has become a habit—a safety net that, while well-intentioned, risks turning a freely given commitment into mere compliance.

The heart of Rotary beats stronger when we call ourselves to action. And showing up is not limited to Saturdays. It also means keeping our fellowship alive through the small but essential habits—reading our Club's Facebook group chats, staying updated via the Cañao Club Bulletin, and promptly responding when assigned a role or task. These simple acts keep our work smooth and ensure no opportunity for connection or service slips away.

Rotary, by its nature, is a voluntary organization. We cannot—and should not—mandate involvement. Yet the beauty of volunteerism lies in the fact that its power comes from personal choice. When made freely, without pressure, that choice holds far greater meaning. Our gatherings, rich with energy, warmth, and purpose, are the visible expression of that choice.

When we joined this club, we embraced an identity—one that values service, fellowship, and shared responsibility. If that identity is alive in us, showing up becomes second nature. Let us see Saturday not as "the day my group is on duty," but as "my day to connect, contribute, and belong."

The magic of Rotary lies not only in what we do, but in how we do it—willingly, joyfully, and without prompting. When presence and engagement become a natural part of who we are, reminders will no longer be needed. What will remain is the shared understanding that we are all part of something truly worth our time, our effort, and our wholehearted presence.
